



# Old Presbyterian manse in danger

Unless this community can come up with \$5000 to help move the building, the old Presbyterian Manse in Richmond Hill will be torn down.

Although there's every indication the Metropolitan and Region Conservation Authority would be delighted to incorporate the 130 year-old structure into its Black Creek Pioneer Village, it will not pay the moving cost.

A final decision will be made today (May 18). The York Chapter of the Pennsylvania German Folk Society of Ontario is considering a donation to cover the cost of a Black Creek foundation.

The Richmond Hill architectural advisory committee says it will organize a fund-raising campaign.
