Public school \$36,000 for outdoor education

The York County board of education decided to commit up to \$36,000 of next year's funds to sending children to the Scanlon Creek Outdoor Education Centre near Lake Simcoe.

For this sum, the board ensures a maximum of 100 days use of the facility, though leaving

its options open to use (and pay for) fewer days. "There's no initial capital costs involved," said Chairman Craig Cribar. "There's no '77 budget costs required. The facility won't be built until 1978.

Trustee Terrance O'Grady tried to defer the matter to next year's

board budget discussions, "rather than move a matter of next year's budget now."

"If we defer the motion, we'll be losing out," countered Doreen Quirk.

"If we don't allow our staff to go ahead, other boards with more foresight will take all 200 days and our students will be left out in the cold," she said.

Trustees Cameron and Stephens criticised the staff report for being vague when it came to possible hidden costs.

In a recorded vote, Trustees Bowes, Weller, O'Grady, Taylor and Stephens opposed a resolution instructing staff to work out an agreement with the South, Lake Simcoe Conservation Authority similar to that affecting use of the Boyd Park in Woodbridge.

The Scanlon Creek Centre houses 40 students a day.

Suffer knife wounds

Leslie Graham Page, 19, formerly of Richmond Hill, is in stable condition at Kingston General Hospital, where he was taken after allegedly slashing his arms last week.

Another inmate, Donald Oag, 26, formerly of London, Ont., was also in stable condition after an emergency operation.

Oag was stabbed 13 times in various parts of his body, while in the exercise yard, according to a penitentiary spokesman.

Page, who was also in the yard at the time, was found in his cell 40 minutes later with the self-inflicted wounds, a penitentiary spokesman said.

Page is serving a five-year sentence for robbery.

\$91,500 in grants held up

Suggested regional grants to health and social services totalling \$91,500 are referred back to a budget meeting.

Included is a \$3,000 grant recommendation for Help — a Woodbridge information and referral centre. This would be the organization's first regional grant, \$6,000 was requested.

Other organizations on the list are: The Salvation Army (\$2,500); Aurora-Newmarket Family Life Centre (\$10,000); and the Markham Family Life Centre (\$17,000).

The Richmond Hill Family Life Centre is slated for the biggest grant; \$18,300.
