

## Boys arrested

Police have arrested four juveniles, aged 10, 12, 14 and 15, in connection with thefts in Markham and Richmond Hill, May 29.

Police said three of the four broke into Walter Scott public school, Markham Rd., Markham, and stole a quantity of audio visual equipment.

They hid the equipment in the schoolyard and then went to Elmwood and Colbourne Aves. in Richmond Hill, where they broke into a car and stole several items, police said.

After that they returned to the school, where they damaged several windows before being arrested.

**Cold cash**

## Objects to gas price

Councillor Mike Burnie feels another increase in Consumer Gas's rate of return would be irresponsible. He said so at Monday night's Council meeting.

"The gas companies have huge reserves. Their deliveries are not going to change. Yet they're saying their costs are up," he said.

"The Ontario Energy Board is being a little lax in allowing these wholesale increases. I feel the government should take some kind of a stand. I really feel they are irresponsible in requesting another increase."

Councillor John Birchall said he could support increased costs being recovered "but I can't buy an increase in the rate of return."

Councillor Marylo Graham moved council go on record as opposing any increase in the rate of return.

"Let's be consistent," argued Councillor Lou Wainwright. "Was there a resolution objecting to a five cent increase in the cost of gasoline a few months ago?"

The Graham resolution passed.
