Field representative Mark Courtemanche said that only a minority of arthritis sufferers are receiving the best care which medicine can now provide.

Only with more people, more research and better communication can this situation be remedied.

Communities now provide almost \$2,000,000 each year for the training of arthritis specialists and for medical research. But \$4,000,000 is needed by 1981. The Society is convinced the disease can be conquered in the foreseeable




