**Move approved**

Final approval has been received from Metro Conservation Authority for moving the old Presbyterian Manse in Richmond Hill to Black Creek Pioneer Village.

However, there's a hitch. Some \$8,000 is needed to move the 130-year-old building and to supply a foundation, according to Russell Cooper, MCA curator.

He said initial cost would be about \$11,000, with Wintario paying one-third. So far, local fund raisers have only come up with \$138.

Cooper said the manse would be placed across the street from the Fisherville Presbyterian Church, which has been in the Village since it opened in 1960.

The village of Fisherville was once located at Yonge St. and Steeles Ave.

**\$300 donated by depot**

The Thornhill Recycling Association has donated \$100 to the York Summit District Boy Scouts, the Red Cross and the Pool for Markham fund.

These donations were made possible through revenue from the sale of recyclable materials donated by the residents of the Thornhill community.

**Wild ride on main street**

The circus may have come and gone, but the memory, apparently, lingers on.

Police arrested three people Sunday night (June 19) as a result of a wild ride down Yonge St. in Richmond Hill.

According to police, two of the people were lying across the roof and the hood of the car, respectively.

The driver was doing 50 miles an hour. Charged with dangerous driving was Fred Willey, 19, of 31 Song Meadowway, Willowdale.

Charged with causing a disturbance by shouting were David Kindness, 22, of 160 Colbourne Ave., Richmond Hill, and Wayne Cyr, 22, of 199 Henderson Ave., Thornhill.

**Townhouses opposed**

The Ontario Municipal Board Thursday accepted a petition with 141 names objecting to a 29-unit townhouse development in old Markham.

Duncan E. Crich, 18 Sir Percival Court, said as a new resident he had just found out last week about the proposal for the Almond property on Church Street next to the ravine.

The board reserved its

decision on the rezoning application.

Crich said the townhouses would decrease market values on Sir Percival Court where prices range from \$80,000 to \$150,000. The development would add children in already crowded schools and increase traffic.

Ted Januszewski, the town planning director, said he wanted to see townhouses on small, isolated sites to provide a housing mix in Markham.

The Almond site was the last isolated one in the old town away from single family dwellings.

A Bell Canada utility building is on one side and a separate school behind the lot.

The high school is across the street and townhouses across the ravine.

Januszewski admitted in cross examination there are few townhouses in plans for large new developments on the periphery of old Markham.

Fred Wood, solicitor for Markham Ratepayers Inc., wanted to know what precautions were being taken to protect the top of the ravine bank on one side of the lot.

Januszewski said the town would require a snow fence along the top during construction to stop any bulldozer operator from dumping fill across the line.

The planning director and the ratepayer's lawyer disagreed on what a conditional approval of the Metropolitan Toronto and Region Conservation Authority meant.

Wood also wanted to know why the proposed playground for the condominium development was in a position where the town recreation director had once opposed it.

The director said the position presented a danger because too many children had to cross the townhouse drives to get to it.

Ratepayers objected to the townhouse proposal

for years and the development was scaled down from 36 originally proposed.

The town did not allocate sewage for the location until Sept. 28 last year.

Seven single family homes would be built without rezoning.

Wood argued the development would be "piecemeal" and there was no valid planning reason for a rezoning.

Town Solicitor Ronald King said zoning application was for townhouses because the owner asked for townhouses. It was his right.

**Driver upset**

A motorist became upset after being involved in a minor accident on Yonge St. in Richmond Hill June 14.

He is charged with causing mischief under \$50.

Police said the motorist kicked the door of the other car, causing some damage.

Charged was Randolph Yu-Ming Yang, 30, of 60 Inverlochy Boulevard, Thornhill.

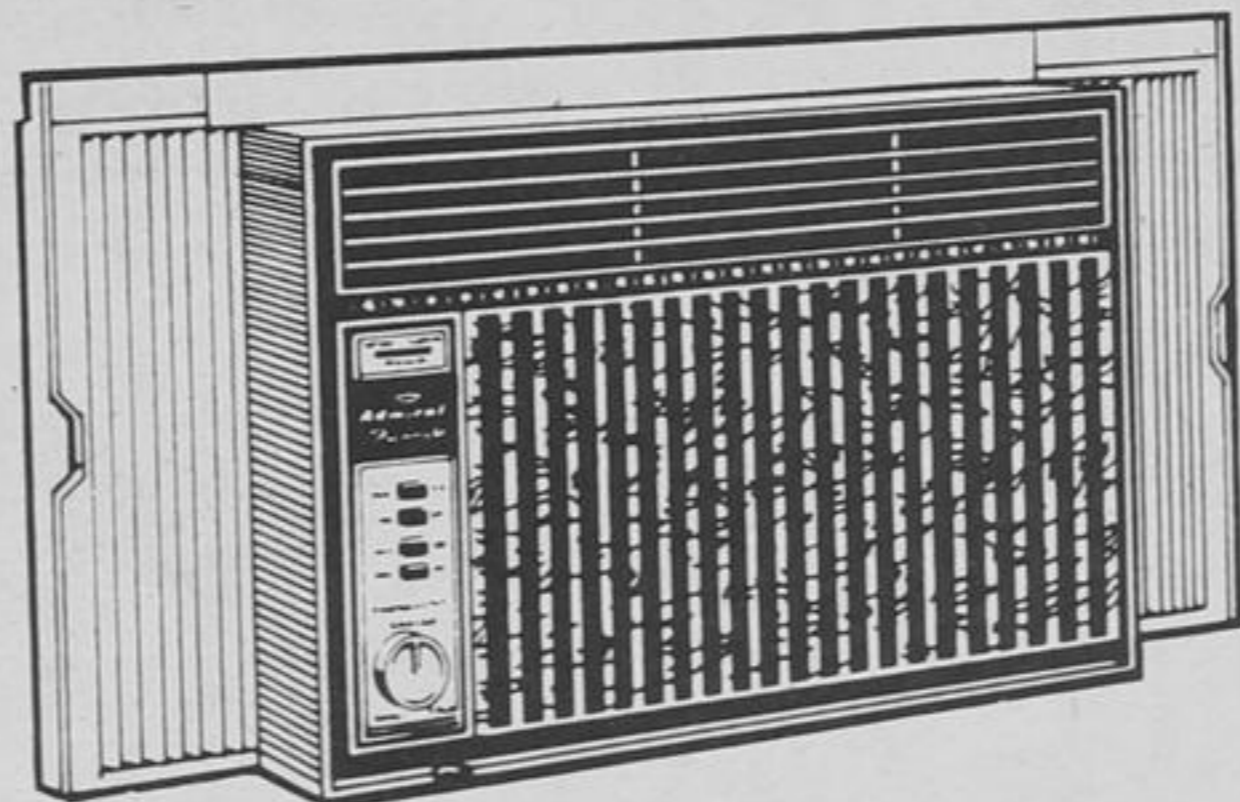
