

Police Briefs

Police have arrested two men in connection with an armed robbery at Becker's Milk Store, 9014 Yonge St., and are seeking three more men in connection with another milk store robbery in Maple.

Charged with armed robbery were Robert William Wilson, 25, of Elgin Mills Rd., Richmond Hill, and Keith Swindlehurst, 19, of no fixed abode.

The two were arrested shortly after the Richvale store was robbed of \$300 by two men. Police said one of them had a shotgun, which he held on the manager, while the other man robbed the till.

Swindlehurst and Wilson appeared in provincial court, July 22, at a show cause hearing and were granted \$5,000 bail.

The Maple robbery took place at a Becker outlet at 2414 Major Mackenzie Dr., July 19.

Police said three men entered the store about 10:55 p.m.

One of them held a gun on the cashier, while the other cleaned out the cash register and also removed the wallet from the cashier's purse.

They also disconnected the telephone cord before leaving.

The three, who escaped with \$90, were said to all be between 18 and 19 and about five feet, eight inches tall.

Turned himself in

Police picked up another robbery suspect in the act, only to have him escape from custody when they went looking for his alleged accomplice.

Police said they went to the home of Lorne Boyle, 9 Leonard St., about 2:10 a.m., July 21, and found a man inside the house.

The man was placed in a police cruiser and a citizen was left in charge, while the police checked for a second man.

The arrested man then broke out of the car and ran into a field, where he was re-arrested shortly afterwards.

Police also recovered about \$400 in stolen property.

A second man turned himself into police the next day.

Charged with break, enter and theft, possession of a dangerous weapon and escaping lawful custody, was David Nelson, 29, of Roosevelt Dr., Thornhill.

Robert Galbraith, 36, of Abitibi Ave., Willowdale, was charged on the first two counts.

Just kidding

A 15-year-old Rexdale youth was charged with public mischief as a result of an incident in Vaughan last week.

Police said the youth told them he had been robbed of \$58, while walking along Langstaff Rd., July 22.

However, he later admitted he had made the whole thing up, as he owed several people money and he didn't want his parents to know what he had done with the cash he had.

Remnants

Police reported the theft of 40 cartons of cloth remnants from Remnant Town, 9218 Yonge St., Richmond Hill.

According to police, 50 cartons of remnants were delivered to the building and some laborers were hired to unload the truck and set up the store.

The theft, totalling \$2,500, was discovered shortly after the work was carried out.

Eddie Shack, too

In Woodbridge, thieves broke into the Eddie Shack Golf Club, Rutherford Rd., and made off with \$185 cash and four cartons of cigarettes.

In Richmond Hill, Eric Klingenstein, 16th Ave., reported the theft of \$8 Canadian money, \$28 in American, 250 German marks, plus a quantity of jewelry, in a break-in at his home.

The loss was estimated at \$768.

The thief who visited the home of Brian Turner, Thornridge Dr., Thornhill, made off with much the same thing as the one who dropped in on the Richmond Hill residence.

Taken was \$600 American money, \$300 Canadian and some jewelry, for a total haul of \$1,000.

In another Thornhill theft, Robert Goodman, Royal Orchard Boulevard, lost a \$700 color TV set to someone, who entered his first-floor apartment via an unlocked screen door.

\$3,000 damage in lumber fire

The fire started in a post stripper machine, being operated at the rear of the building. It then spread to a nearby pile of wood chips, but was contained and extinguished by Aurora fire department.

It was not known whether the fire was caused by an electrical failure, or through wood chips being heated by the machine engine.

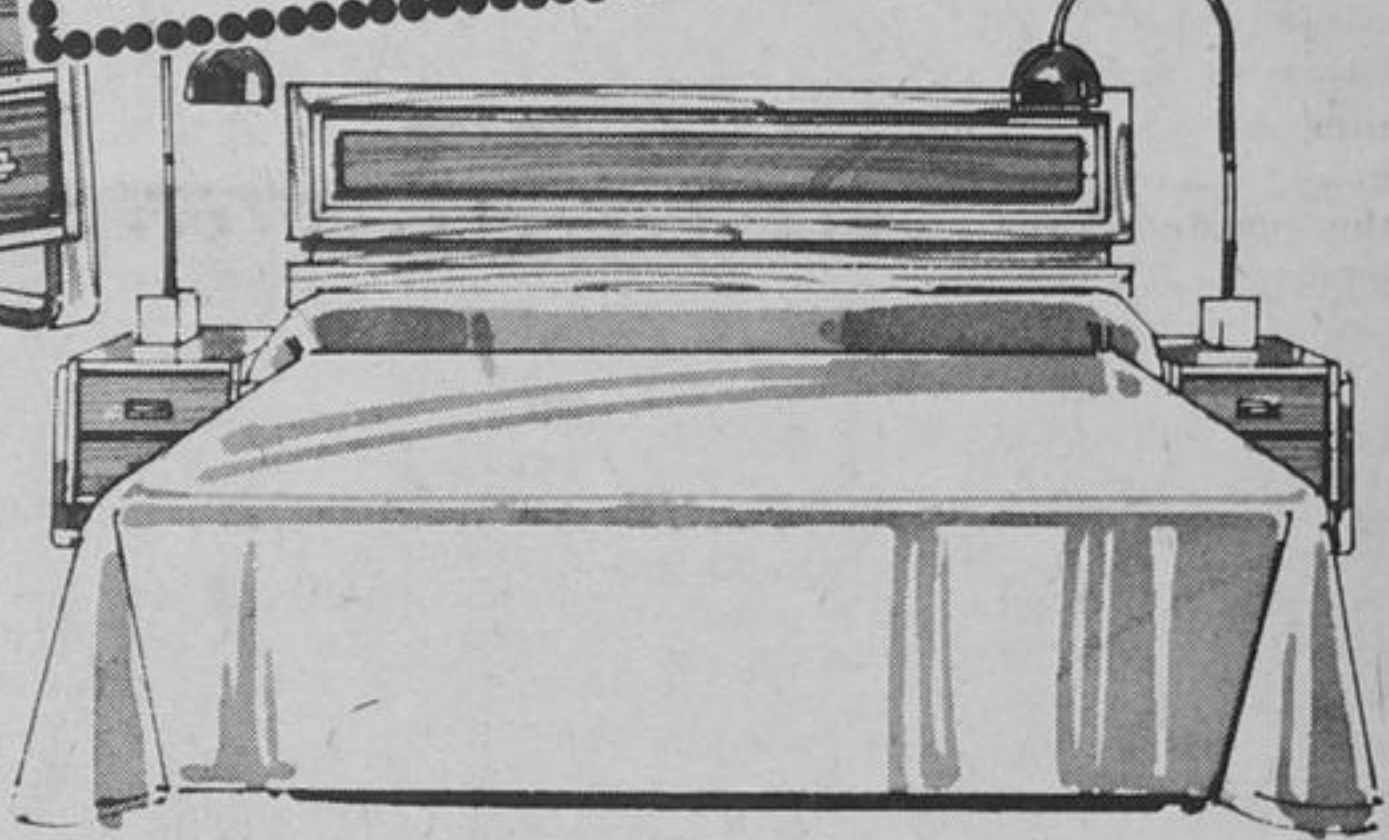
