Steve Cox: Tennis star

Steve Cox of Richmond Hill never got around to playing tennis until he was 16 years old because he was "too interested in hockey".

That's why he'll never know whether he could have gone on to make it in U.S. college circles by way of a hockey scholarship.

It doesn't matter. He got there anyway.

The 21-year-old Cox has just completed two years at Seminole Community College in Florida where he did "pretty well".

Wotta record

His record includes a total of 46 wins against 19 losses; he was twice player of the year in Division 2, twice Florida singles runner-up; and he won the prestigious Cocoa Beach Tournament in 1976; plus numerous other victories against top-flight competition.

Seminole's college tennis program terms him "one of the finest players to ever play at Seminole."

His accomplishments at Seminole caught the attention of officials at Louisiana University who

proffered a \$4,000 tennis scholarship.

Cox accepted. "It's what I was aiming for from the beginning," Cox said. "Recognition from a major college. Getting to Seminole gave me the exposure and the competition you need to make it."

It wasn't easy.

Hard work

"I play tennis, tennis, and more tennis," Cox said. "And when I'm not doing that I'm working out with weights, running and so forth."

"It's a matter of gaining more experience each year, getting a little faster, a little stronger, and simply playing a lot all-year round."

Cox has managed his achievements to date with a minimum of complications.

"I don't have a lot of moves," he said. "I simply have a hard shot with lots of spin. In fact, it's the only shot I have."

It's more than enough. "Louisiana has a fine tennis program and the competition will be even tougher but that's what you need to improve.

They have signed the

number one players from England and Holland. So it'll be an interesting year."

Games

Cox's accomplishments have now spread to Canada with the announcement that he'll be one of four men and four women representing Ontario in the Canada Games in Newfoundland

Aug. 5. "I'm happy about it. It's a great honor to represent your province in a situation like this. And it'll be a great experience."

Cox, who is also an instructor at the Thornhill Tennis Club, has been busy on the tournament front this summer.

He's played in four tournaments to date getting to the finals in

Brantford, first in Kingston, and then winning the Inter County for the fourth straight time.

Like busy.

Come Aug. 28 he'll be packing his racquet and heading down to Louisiana where he'll study pharmacy.

And, of course, play a little tennis.

Townhouses okayed in Thornhill area

The Ontario Municipal Board will order a designation that will allow townhouses on the northeast corner of Bayview and John Streets.

A full hearing before the board was averted when the Baywood Heights Residents Association and the developer reached agreement on the character of development on the 10-acre parcel.

The residents have signed an agreement with the developer to allow up to 104 townhouses on the property with a minimum floor area of 1,450 square feet.

Robert Artinger, secretary of the residents' association, said the agreement will guarantee the density at about 9.5 units per acre. The town designation could have allowed up to 15 units per acre.

Their size means the homes will be "prestige" townhouses, Artinger explained.

The residents were concerned that a large number of children would overload already crowded schools and the community centre.

A specific plan for the sight is still on the drawing board.
