## Holy Hula Popper

As fishing with a surface lure, such as the Hula Popper or the Jitter Bug, is, in my opinion, among the most rewarding experiences, if not the ultimate in excitement that only an angler can truly understand.

During the present hot spell, top-water lures produce excellent results, especially in the late evening hours and during the night. Largemouth bass, pike and musky as well as many of the smaller species such as crappies fall for a well-presented top-water lure.

For your best outfit, select a medium action spinning or casting rod — the one you already have will be just fine.

Reels, however are a different story as they must be of good quality and you must know your reel with closed eyes for there will be no fooling around in the dark.

Line between six and ten pound test is most often used. I suggest you use no leaders but tie your line directly to the lure.

### Shallow bay

In the late evening or during the night, find a shallow bay with plenty of water lilies or other plant cover. Should you be fishing from the shore, approach as though you were stalking an unsuspecting animal.

If you are fishing from a boat, keep well out from the shore and cast toward the shoreline. Be certain that you are familiar with your tackle and the water in which you are fishing as it can be pretty frustrating to end up with twenty yards of your best fishing line wrapped around the nearest tree or your ears.

### Hungry fish

Cast your line out to a likely looking spot and then... do nothing. The hungry fish is waiting out there for some unsuspecting dinner. As your lure hits the water, this fish will get the shock of his life and will take off at his fastest speed.

Ten feet later he stops, satisfied that your lure presents no danger.  
Country slowly  
While you count slowly up to 30 without moving the lure, he gets very interested and swims cautiously back to the lure. However, as there is no movement, he loses interest and eyes the lure very suspiciously.  
Your 30 seconds are just about up and you twitch your rod lightly, just about enough to make the lure and the fish quiver.  
Now the fish gets all excited again. 'It moves, but it sure doesn't look like a frog or a mouse. I'll be ready, just in case it moves again!'  
A few seconds have passed now and you're retrieving your lure very slowly. This is just too much for the fish. He moves in so there will be no way this morsel can get away from him. He takes a dive, then there's a splash that sounds like your fishing buddy in the brink, and the fight begins.  
Big fight  
What a fight! You really have no idea where the fish is, or even what hit your lure. 'Perhaps', you think, 'I've hit into a new record'.  
For those who can fish near a cottage or along a beach, I suggest that you give the area a try about an hour after the swimmers have gone. During the day, swimmers have disturbed the bottom and much food has floated to the surface. This is when all the minnows come in to feed and the bass and even walleye are not far behind to feed on the minnows.  
To those who would rather fish than sleep, surface fishing during the night is definitely the ultimate in sport, one of the few times when all the odds are on the fish's side.
