14 Wintario grants head to this area

Richmond Hill and district organizations will cash in on half the 28 grants coming to York Region from Wintario. Included in the list are:

— \$5,000 to the Town of Markham Public Libraries to assist in the purchase of shelving, furniture and equipment.

— \$3,489 to the Ontario Council of Shooters based in Thornhill towards the costs of coaching development, intensive training, and participation programs.

— The Town of Vaughan Public Libraries will receive \$3,000 for the purchase of Canadian books and materials and talking books.

— \$2,959 to the Richmond Hill Public Library to aid in the purchase of equipment and furnishings.

— The Thornhill Softball League will receive \$2,794 to assist in the purchase of softball equipment.

— The Unionville Skating Club will receive up to \$1,284 to aid in the

cost of installing a sound system to the Crosby Memorial Community Centre.

— The Thornhill Baseball Association will receive \$646 to share in the purchase of ball equipment.

— The Richmond Hill Oldtimers Hockey Club will receive \$550 for travel assistance to attend an invitational hockey tournament in Pointe Claire, Quebec.

— \$424 will go to the Unionville Tennis Club to aid in the purchase of tennis racquets and balls, and umpire's stand and a first aid kit.

— The Richmond Hill Parks and Recreation Department will receive a grant of \$415 to assist in the purchase of materials for the construction of a portable dock.

— The Richmond Hill Hockey Association will receive \$394 to share in the purchase of goalie equipment.

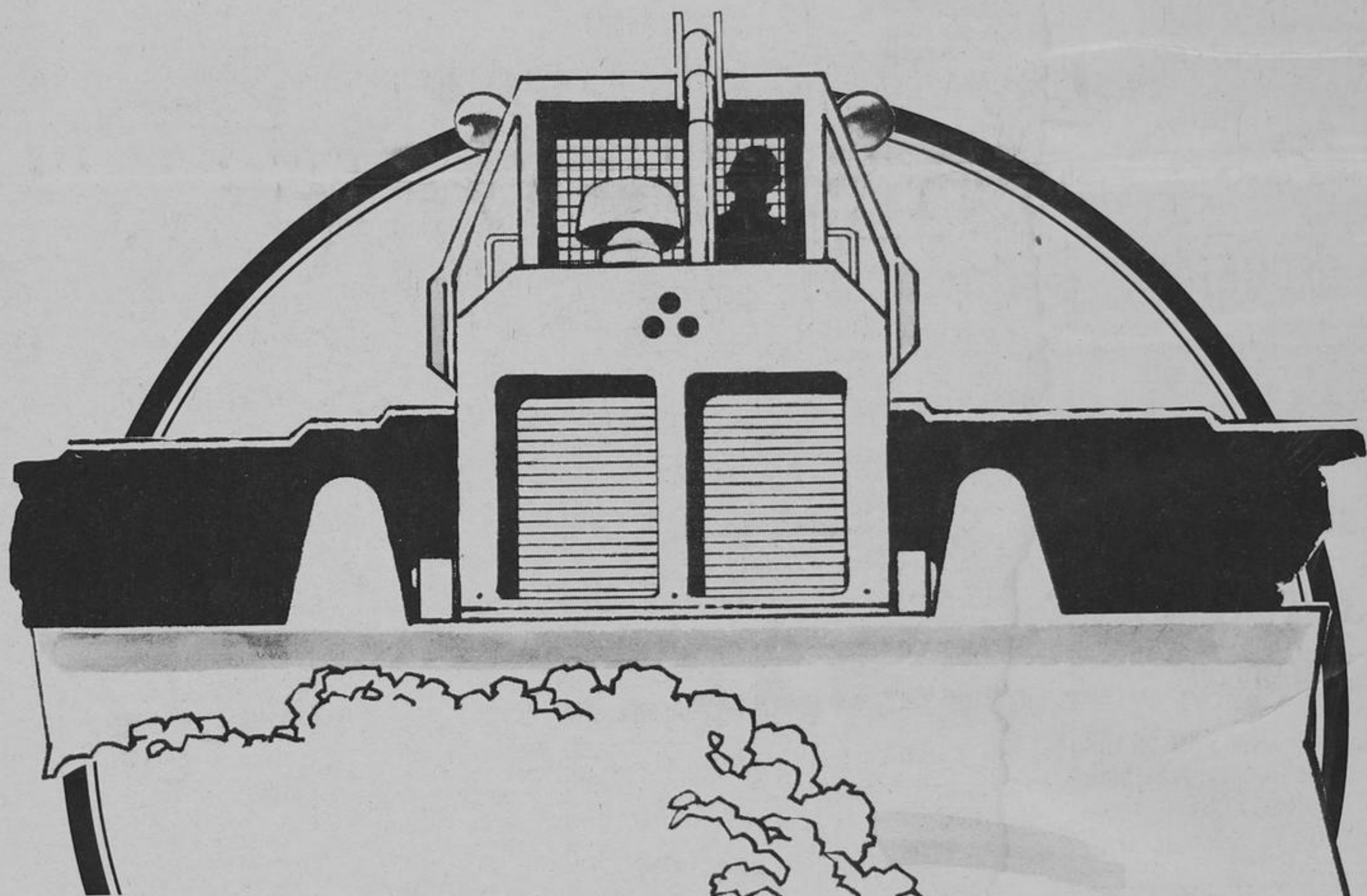
