Family Y sponsors outdoor day camp

Making sumac tea, blindfold walks through the forest, fishing, swimming and building forts are all part of the fun at the Whitechurch Day Camp operated by the York Region Family 'Y', for children aged 6 to 12.

This is the second year the camp has been located at the Whitechurch Conservation Area, on the Aurora Sideroad about two miles east of Don Mills Road.

Prior to this, the camp operated at the Mill Pond Park area said camp director, Anne Babcock, a

third year sociology student at York University.

"There is more space here, about 25 acres, which makes a better camping atmosphere," she said. "We can use the land free of charge which is a great advantage and the location is fairly central to all of York Region."

Due to restrictions by conservation authorities, the campers cannot go swimming in the pond but go to the Vander pool instead where they receive 20 minutes of swimming lessons and

the rest free swim, twice a week.

"The pond is clean enough to swim in and I'm trying to get a waterfront director for next year so we can make use of it. Campers fish in the pond now but usually throw back the little sunfish they catch," said Ms. Babcock.

Three buses pick up the 120 or so campers from Richmond Hill, Thornhill and Aurora to take them to the camp.

It costs \$60 for a two-week session and there are still openings for the remaining sessions this summer.

Binder Twine ready for Sept 10

The tenth Kleinburg Binder Twine Festival will be held September 10 from noon to midnight on the village's main street.

Opening ceremonies will be at 1 p.m. followed by continuous main stage entertainment throughout the day winding up in the evening with street dancing for a variety of tastes.

Bands will provide rock music, accompaniment for square dancers and the big band sound.

Home made apple pies, jams, jellies and sarsaparilla and birch beer will be sold. A field of corn is grown especially to provide fresh corn-on-the-cob for the day. Home made smoked sausages and baked beans will be served for dinner.

The festival was launched as a centennial project in 1967 and takes its theme from the binder twine delivery nights started by Charlie Shaw, a local tinsmith, in 1892. He used to invite all his

customers to come and pick up their supplies of twine for binding up wheat sheaves.

Admission to the Festival is \$2 with children under 12 and anyone in old-time costume admitted free. Proceeds from past festivals have paid for several community projects, most recently the restoration of the old CPR station as headquarters for boy scouts and girl guides.

A grant was also made to oppose Cam Milani's development plans before the Ontario Municipal Board.

This year, Milani refused to allow his land to be used for parking for the festival. The Kleinburg Lions Club will again be taking care of the parking this year. It will be provided in new locations on the parking lots of the two schools in the village, off Shingleton Avenue, said Susan Tooley of the Binder Twine committee.
