Thornhill tied it in the fourth as Marchand singled, Debbie Donofrio walked and Jeanette Russell was safe on a bunt to load the bases. Cathy Pacini was safe on an error as the tying run

scored. Thornhill scored two runs in the top of the seventh as Michelle Bowers walked and came home on Louise Poirier's triple. Joan Sellers then singled home Thornhill third run.

Richmond Hill made its stirring comeback in the final inning as Debbie Milnes walked, Kelly MacInnis singled and Sam Chefero walked to load the bases. Nelson then singled to left to score Milnes to make it 3-2.

Sheila Harrison was safe on a fielder's choice forcing Kelly at the plate.

Katie McNamara then flew to left field scoring Chefero to tie the game. Bonnie Bryan was the heroine as she singled home the winning run. It was her third hit in four trips to the plate.

Richmond Hill had lost the opener 11-3 but had bounced back to win the second game 14-1 in impressive fashion.

It would have been the finals this season except, of course, for Glenfield.

That final game saw the visitors wrapping the game up with six runs in the fifth inning off pitchers Kelly MacInnis and Darline Nelson who relieved her in that fifth

inning. Winning pitcher was Anne Gibson.

"They only outthit us 12 to 11," said Mary, "but we couldn't get them when they counted."

She also felt the absence of her top hitter, Sue O'Connell, hurt the team's chances. "Sue might have made the difference," she said.

The 11-3 loss to Glenfield saw Nelson giving up 14 hits while walking two.

Glenfield got two runs in the second and third innings, three in the fourth, three in the fifth, and one in the sixth.


Richmond Hill got one run in the fourth on hits by Nelson, O'Connell and an error; and two more in the fifth inning when Sue Emry walked, Kelly MacInnis was safe on an error, followed by singles by Debbie Milnes and Nelson.

Kelly MacInnis was the

winning pitcher the 14-1 victory giving up six hits, walking none and striking out two.

Richmond Hill got 12 hits off Glenfield pitching with Bonnie Bryan showing the way with a four-for-four night at bat; O'Connell went three for four including two triples.
