Dune buggy course

Sewer project mess good for something

What better place for a dune buggy than a wind-swept beach — unless it is in the midst of the Richvale sewer project.

At three cars bogged down in the mud on Yongeview Avenue

Thursday but Tim Jackson, 12, was next to airborne hurtling over the ditches and torn up road in his three-wheeled buggy.

This is the fifth go-

cart for the 12-year-old tinkerer; from his first wooden push cart through conventional low-slung go-carts to his latest buggy, all were largely his own creations.

The buggy was actually built by Tim's father, when he was 16, but had been abandoned years before.

Tim hauled it out of the woods and had it running in a week.

The motor, a 3 horsepower industrial model that might otherwise operate a cement mixer, had seized, so a lot of work was involved in putting the buggy back on the road.

The buggy has a 4-speed transmission out of an old Hillman. Brake and clutch pedals are ropes and the pedals are blocks of wood.

The driver's seat came from an old truck.

When Tim adjusts the choke, winds up and pulls the ignition coil, he climbs back into that seat and chugs off like a race car driver around his own backyard obstacle course.

Wintario grants to aid another 15 York projects

Grants totalling \$35,611 have been approved for another 15 projects in the York Region from the proceeds of the Wintario Lottery.

The amounts range from \$20,000 to \$240.

A grant of \$20,000 is to be made to the Aurora Public Library to assist in the purchase of shelving, furniture and equipment.

The York County Rugby Club will receive a grant of \$3,000 to defray the costs of transportation for two teams to attend an invitational rugby tournament in England.

A grant of \$2,263 is to go to the Woodbridge Minor Softball League Association to assist in the purchase of softball equipment.

The Unionville Swimming Club will receive up to \$2,222 to assist in the cost of repairing sand banks and to aid in the purchase and installation of dock units.

A grant of \$1,512 will go to the York Symphony Orchestra in Richmond Hill to share in the costs of a special visiting artist program involving the Abbott String Quartet.

The Newmarket Theatre Centre will receive a grant of \$695 to aid in the purchase of a dimmer panel.

A grant of \$693 will go to the Thornhill Atom Hockey team for travel assistance to attend an invitational tournament in Massachusetts.

The Reusse Construction Pee-wee Hockey team in Thornhill will receive a grant of \$693 to aid in the cost of travelling to the same

Massachusetts tournament.

A grant of \$693 will go to the Aurora Diggers Girls ball team to defray the costs of travel to a recent Kansas City tournament.

The Markham Minor Soccer Club will receive a grant of \$650 to assist in the purchase of soccer balls, a set of nets and first aid kits.

A grant of \$530 will go to the Aurora Church Dodgers for travel assistance to attend an

invitational hockey tournament in Point Claire, Quebec.

Mike Exall of Aurora will receive \$486 to assist in the costs of a study tour of National Leadership Schools in the United Kingdom.

Three Boy Scouts of Canada groups in York will each receive grants to defray the costs of transportation to the Boy Scouts Canadian Jamboree '77 in Prince Edward Island.

The professional hair stylists will come from seven area beauty salons. They have volunteered their services and those of

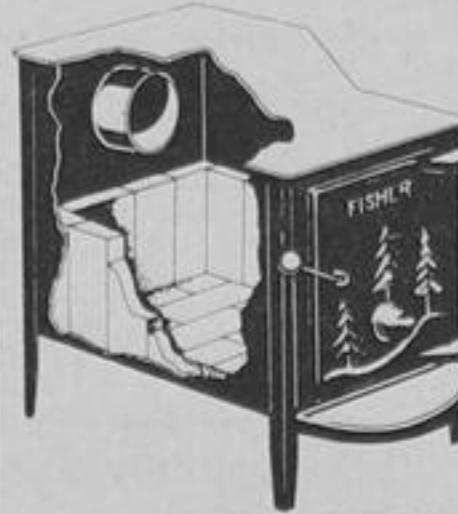
their staffs.
