

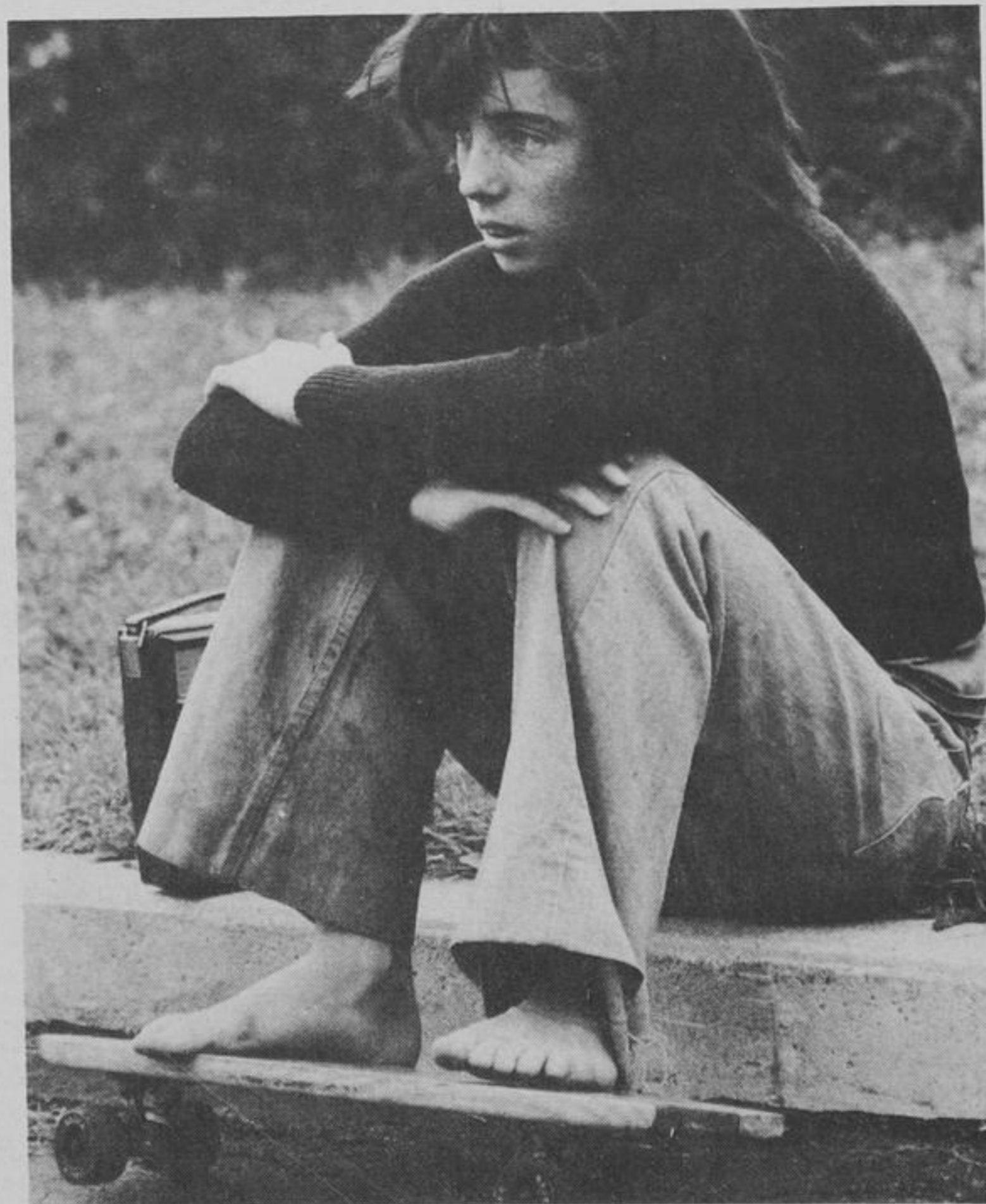
Seneca King plans October Eco-Fair

Seneca College, in cooperation with the Ateed Centre for Environmental Communities, will present "Eco-Fair", a festival of alternatives, next month at King Campus on Dufferin St. Eco-Fair is being developed in two parts. A market-style exhibition will allow the visitor to wander from display to display investigating various forms of energy, alternate life style demonstrations, new and different modes of shelter, and developments in food and agriculture. The focus of the exhibition will be the practical application of the latest advances in technology and the

presentation of the usable information on ecologically aware living. The second part of Eco-Fair will be lectures, films and discussions in the new Phase I complex at King Campus. There will be an opportunity for all participants to attend a variety of exciting presentations and to mix these with visits to the exhibits.

The presentations will be directed to the development of technologies and life styles which 1) contribute to an ecological sound way of supporting human life; 2) minimize the use of non-renewable resources; 3) avoid a cumulatively degrading effect on the environment; 4) do not require more materials than will be available if the earth's resources were equitably distributed among the world's people.
