Nothing to say on Robarts report by Region anyway

York Regional Council had to delay its comments on the Report of the Royal Commission on Metropolitan Toronto a couple of weeks ago when not enough members showed up for a special meeting.

However, apparently the members didn't have anything to say after all about the report, which deals with regional concerns.

The report, which was drawn up by a commission headed by former Ontario Premier John Robarts, along with similar reports from the Niagara region and Ottawa-Carleton, wasn't even discussed at the region's regular meeting

last week.

Mayor Garnet Williams of Vaughan, told The Liberal after the meeting that the region's only concern in the Robarts' Report, was with its recommendations regarding conservation.

Had the report recommended withdrawal of control by the region in existing conservation areas, then it would have had some recommendations of its own to make.

"The other two reports didn't affect us at all," Williams said.

All recommendations on the reports must be submitted to the provincial government by Sept. 15.

Elgin Mills speed limit drops to 50

Everything's back to normal on Elgin Mills Rd. in Richmond Hill.

At least, from Bathurst St. to Yonge St.

After a further look at complaints from residents of the street, plus opposition from the three Richmond Hill representatives of council, York Regional Council last week decided the speed limit should remain at 30 m.p.h. or approximately 50 kph.

Prior to the protests, the region had wanted to up the speed to 60 kph, or

37.5 mph.

Main point of concern with the Hill residents was the number of children using the street and the lack of sidewalks.

Ray Twinney of Newmarket, chairman of the engineering committee, presented the recommendation to reduce the speed, and it was passed unanimously by council.

Council also agreed to keep the speed for a portion of King Sideroad, 500 feet west of the entrance to a school at Keele St., to 30 mph.
