Settlements in schools up 36 percent

A total of 109 settlements out of 200 in negotiations between school boards and teachers in Ontario for the year ending Aug. 31, has been reached, according to Owen B. Shime, chairman of the Education Relations Commission.

Shime said that the over-all rate of settlement was approximately 36 per cent higher than the same time last year.

The commission, which was established by provincial legislation in 1975 to foster relations between school boards and teachers, has appointed fact finders in four elementary school panels, including York County.
