The donated flowers were arranged in floral tributes on standards borrowed from the Civic Garden Centre and later auctioned off to visitors. Each guest was allowed

to take home a rose. Mrs. Calladine mentioned how much the donated flowers were appreciated because most of the members gardens were past their prime.

Thornhill Kiwanis Club did much of the publicity for the show.


