Leaving the Richmond Hill Room at the arena will still be a challenge to those going outside.

A request for \$700 to construct a path to the parking lot was denied by Richmond Hill Council Monday night.

"The door leads to a muddy lot and the area needs improvement," Councillor Al Duffy said, in his attempt to reverse an earlier finance committee decision which denied the request.

Councillor Andre Chateauvert said he had used the exit "and I've managed to survive".

"You have to be careful, though, or you could fall," he said.

Councillor Bill Corcoran said \$700 "doesn't seem too much to rectify the situation".

"It just might make things a bit easier for people at the arena," Councillor Mike Burnie said. "It would be \$700 that is well spent, especially if someone gets hurt."

Councillor Lois Hancey said she sympathized but felt there were more pressing areas where the money could go.

The majority of council agreed.

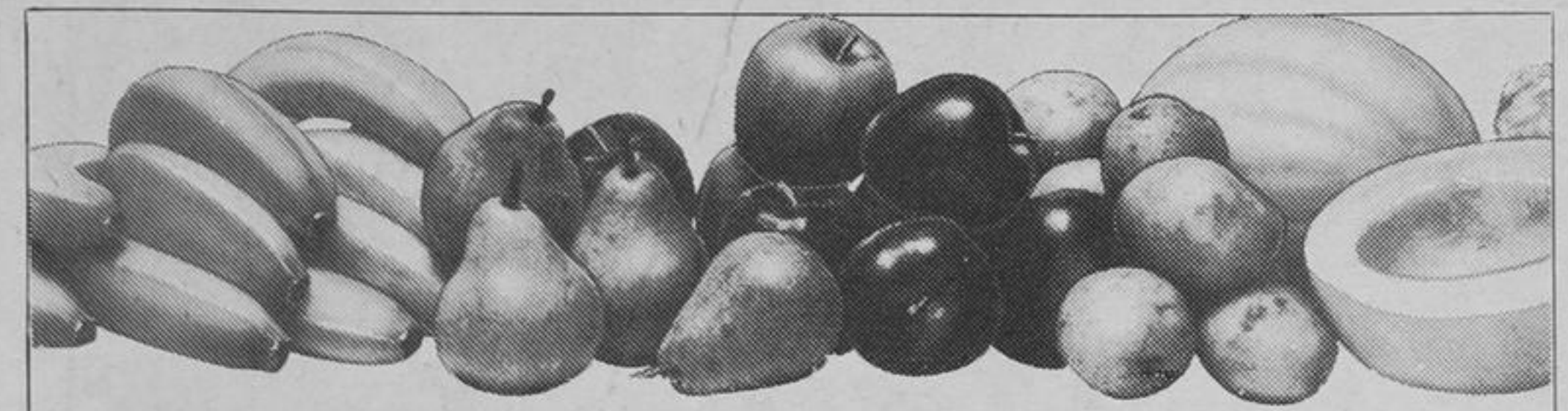
