"You have to be careful, though, or you could fall," he said. Councillor Bill Cor-

coran said \$700 "doesn't seem too much to rectify the situation". "It just might make

things a bit easier for people at the arena," Councillor Mike Burnie said. "It would be \$700 that is well spent, especially if someone gets hurt."

Councillor Lois Hancey said she sympathized but felt there were more pressing areas where the money could go.

The majority of council agreed.
