On Sunday, the grounds open at 1 p.m. with a pinto horse show and exhibits open in all buildings.

Horse judging will continue Monday.

Poultry and dairy cattle competitions will also take place Monday.

Harness races will begin at 2 p.m.

A midway will be set up throughout the duration of the fair, and appearance by "Gunner the Frisbee King" will be one of the many attractions this weekend.

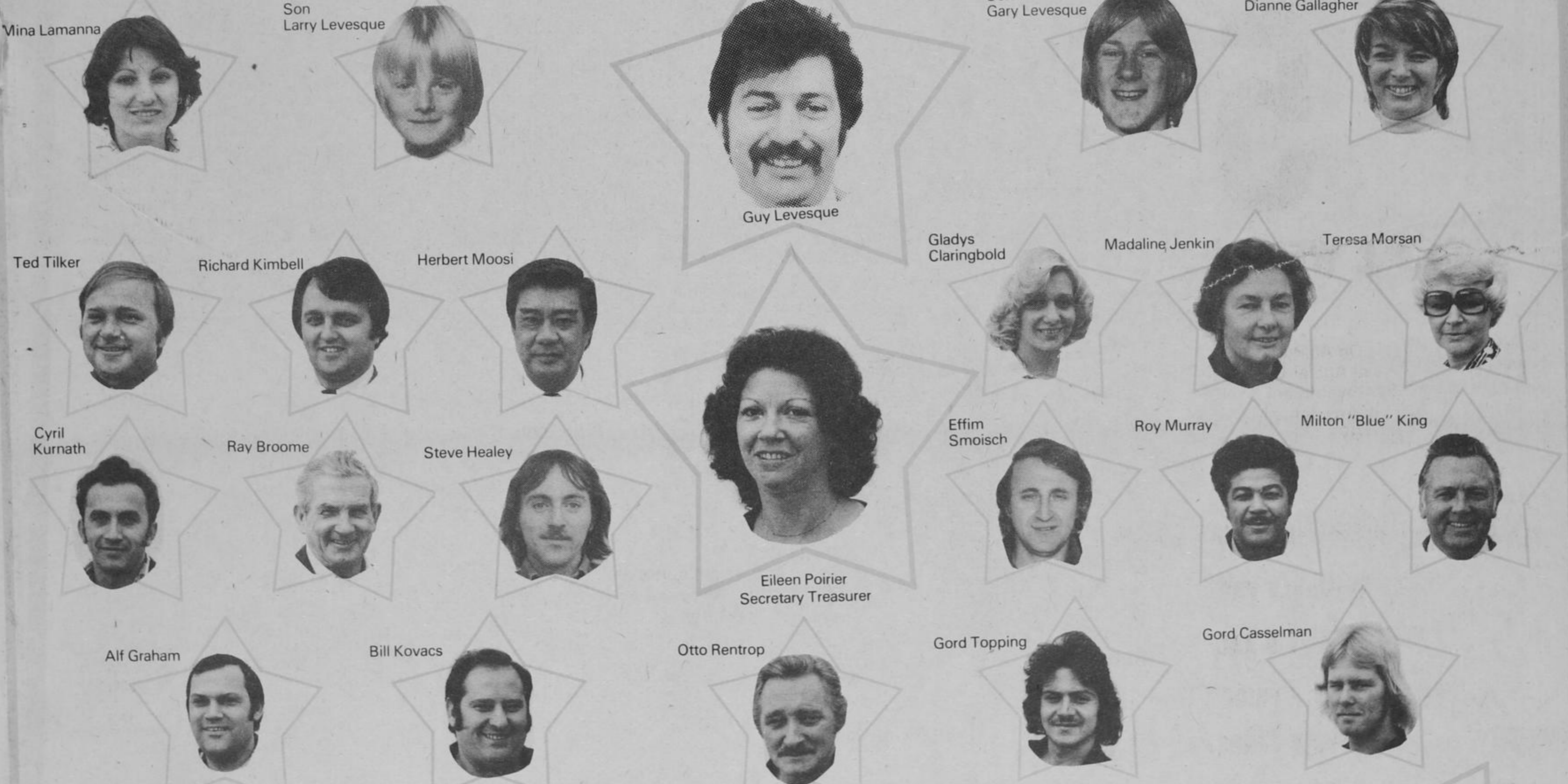
