## New cable TV tower should function by end of Qctober

nearing completion. in operation by the end of antenna location on Elgin affect some 22,000 cable more about the project. this month.

The 250-foot tower, which has been constructed at the firm's Newkirk Road location will soon come into operation as a receiving and distribution point for cable TV subscribers across Southern York Region.

The "Eiffel Type" tower will not only perform the function of a central receiving point for television signals but will also provide the distribution centre for Classic Communication's new microwave system.

The microwave concept will be utilized in distributing telephone signals to pick up points in Thornhill, Markham, Vaughan and Stouffville.

Officials of Classic Communications Ltd. have said this newly designed microwave technique will greatly improve their subfun is asked to call Hugh scribers' reception and at the same time reduce cable outages caused by local hydro failures.

The microwave concept based on the distribution of television signals using a line of sight beam effect.

Because of this many of the cable company's long cable lines will no longer be needed.

The result for local customers will be cleaner, crisper pictures and a greatly reduced chance of reception interruption.

The half-million dollar tower project has been planning and engineering and final approval, by both the Federal Department of Communication and the Canadian Radio Television and Telecommunications Commission.

Although the tower itself is now complete, final preparations are still being made in the placement of related equipment.

Area residents may already have seen construction workers perched high atop the tower attaching reception antennae and adjusting the placement of the microwave dishes.


