### SUMMARY TO BY-LAW NUMBER 156-77

The lands affected by this by-law consist of two parcels, "Part 1" shown on Schedule 'A" to the by-law being at the south east corner of Highway #400 and Major Mackenzie Drive consisting of those portions of Lot 20, Lot 19 and the north half of Lot 18, Concession 5 lying between Highway #400 and Jane Street and "Part 2" shown on the Schedule which is the north/east corner of Highway #400 and Major Mackenzie Drive consisting of that portion of Lot 21, Concession 5, between Highway #400 and Jane Street. The lands are zoned Agricultural (A) Zone by By-law Number 2523 of The Corporation of the Township of Vaughan.

Council has adopted Amendment Number 74 of the Official Plan of the Town of Vaughan to permit the development of the lands as a Theme Park. The subject by-law was enacted to implement this amendment to the Official Plan. The by-law permits the use of the lands south of Major Mackenzie Drive for amusement rides and exhibitions, games of skill and chance, establishments for the sale of food and/or drinks, office and administration buildings, parking areas and sewerage and water treatment facilities. The lands north of Major Mackenzie Drive may be used for the purposes of a hotel, motel, parking areas, service station, campground and trailer park. No structure may be erected nearer to a boundary line than the distance of twice the height of the structure or 50 feet which ever is the greater. No amusement ride or exhibition may be erected nearer to the easterly lot line, which is Jane Street, than 500 feet. No structure shall exceed 150 feet in height but the height is measured from a point which is 750 feet above sea level which is the elevation attributed to the Maple Airport under the regulations affecting its operation. This maximum height is reduced if the structure is located within the extension of the runway Flight Path and Transitional Areas shown on Schedule "B" and the maximum height applicable to those areas is determined by following the procedure set out in paragraph (f) in the by-law. These provisions are to ensure that the operation of the airport is not inhibited. If the airport ceases operations and the land is re-zoned paragraph (f) becomes ineffective.

Although there is no reference in the subject by-law to the submission of a site plan agreement the lands are subject to By-law Number 2523 and it authorizes the Municipality to require an agreement prior to the issue of a building permit dealing with widenings of highways, access ramps, parking, walkways, grading, storm water, watermains, landscaping, location of buildings and structures etc.
