Savings bond organizer back for 9th year

Donald R. Loader of Willowdale has been appointed organizer in the 1977 Canada Savings Bond Campaign, payroll savings division, for the Metro Toronto and Simcoe County area.

His territory includes Richmond Hill, Aurora, Newmarket, Midland, Penetang, Barrie, Gravenhurst, Huntsville, and Orillia.

In addition to the Compound Interest Bond available on payroll savings plans at places of employment, investors have a choice. They can buy either this bond or the Regular Interest Bond wherever they bank or invest.

Both bonds are dated November 1, 1977, carry a nine-year term and provide 8.06 per cent average annual yield to maturity. Interest rate in the first year is 7.0 per cent, then 8.25 per cent for each subsequent year to maturity in 1986.
