Car manufacturers and dealers have been asked to distribute them to purchasers of new cars and the stickers are available from the Ministry.

Here are the car repair tips: • If your car warranty still applies, review it carefully and determine exactly who pays for what.

• Check your Owner's Manual; you may find the solution to your problem right

• Be specific when describing the problem to your serviceman and don't be afraid to ask questions.

 Ask for an estimate before proceeding with major repairs. Make sure all work is authorized by you and never sign a blank work order.

• Get full details on repair work warranties (parts and labour).

If you feel that you have been misled or deceived, you may appeal under The Business Practices Act.

Your Provincial Government wants you to know what your rights are under The Business Practices Act.




