Materials including newspapers, corrugated cardboard, metal and glass can be used again and again.

They are not lost forever as is the case with most garbage.

Payments are received for tonnage of the above materials, collected and

delivered to the recycling agents.

Monies received in payment are donated to worthwhile local non-profit and charitable organizations within the community of Thornhill like the Block Parents Plan, Richmond Hill Thornhill Family Services, Garbage Coalition, United Appeal, "Happy Teens", Society for Children with Learning Disabilities, Villa Hospital Children's Fund, Helpmate Services, Thornhill Community Centre Library, Thornhill Village Library, Gallanough Library, Pool for Markham, Red Cross Society and District Boy Scouts.

The garbage contractors reimburse the Town of Markham by the amount of \$4 per ton for materials collected by the depot.

The individual resident can reduce the weekly

garbage output by one-third to one-half.

The depot, manned entirely by volunteers, is located on Bayview Avenue at Green Lane, immediately north of The Thornhill Community Centre and is open 7-8:30 p.m. Thursdays and 10-12 noon on Saturdays.

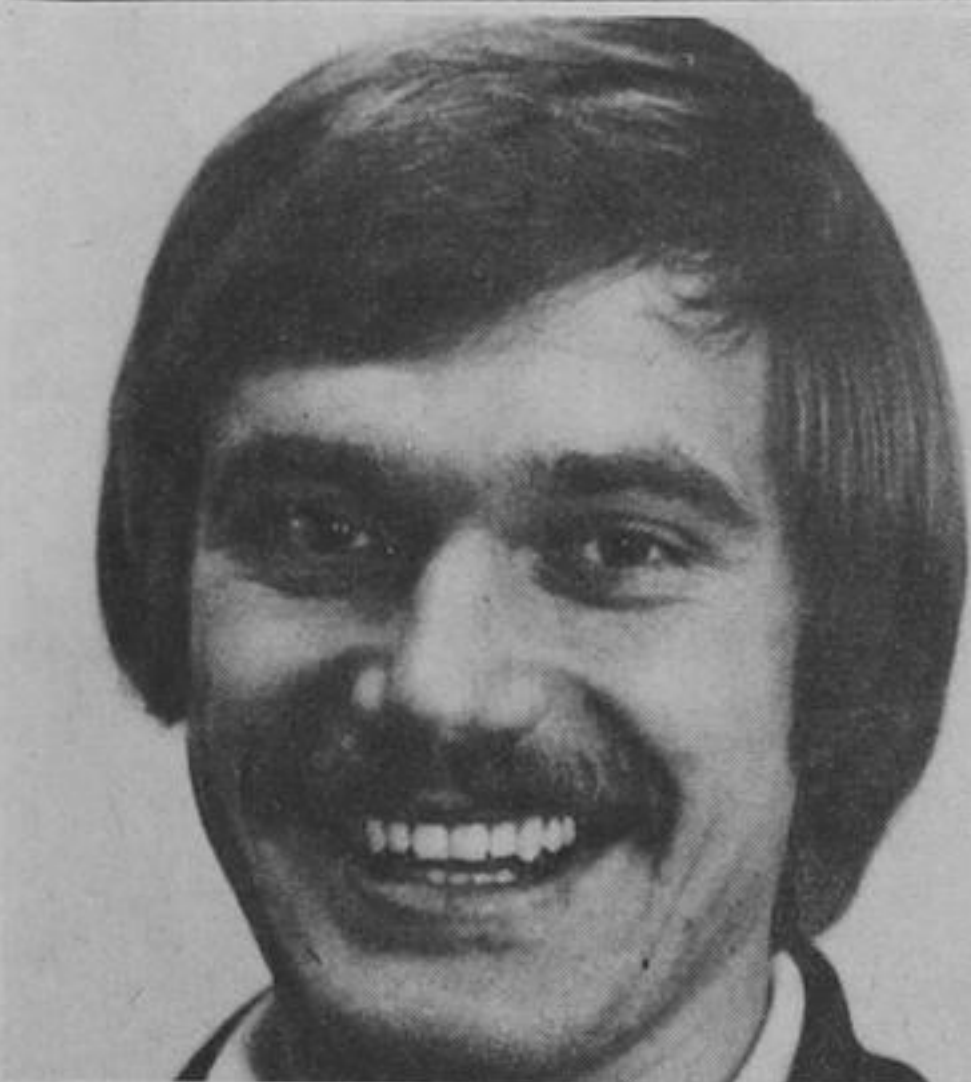
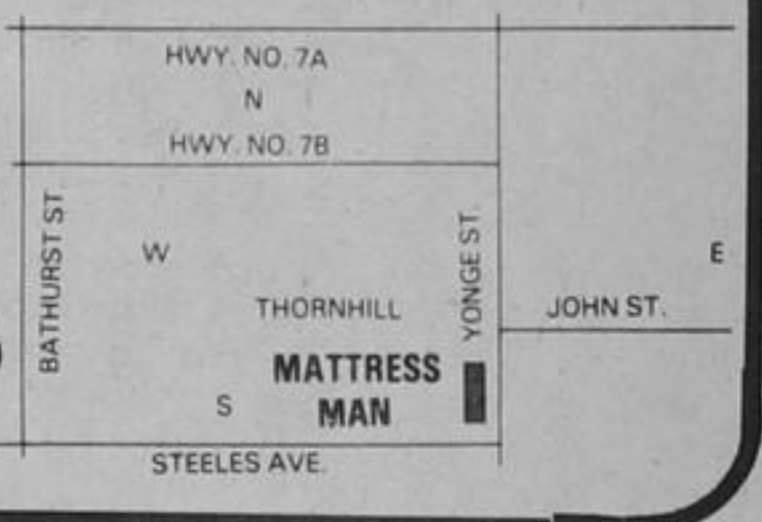

# Cedar Grove club wants tax break

The Cedar Grove Community Club wants a tax break.

The club operates and maintains the 7-acre park

at Steeles Avenue and the 10th line of Markham which contains a lighted ball diamond, volleyball court, shuffleboard courts and picnic areas.

The diamond is used by Cedar Grove teams as well as teams from other parts of Markham and Scarborough areas.

Non Cedar Grove teams pay \$15 per night to defray maintenance and hydro costs.

The park was expropriated for the North Pickering project in 1974 and leased back to the Cedar Grove Community Club for \$1 plus taxes.

The taxes for 1977 amount to \$443 and there are no arrears, says town recreation director Brian Wigglesworth.

The club's request for a tax break will go before a council committee this month.

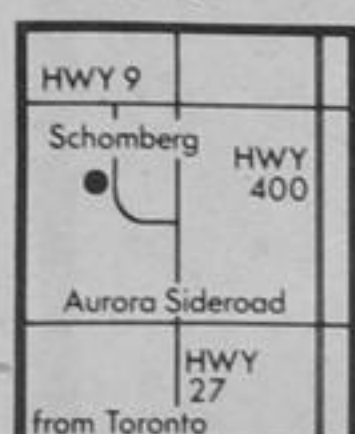
