The wine and cheese will get the evening underway, while youthful pianist, Chia-Yue Chou, making his second appearance with the orchestra in the last two years, will be the guest.

Presenting his new composition, "Nocturne for String

Orchestra", for the first time, will be the orchestra's regular conductor, Clifford Poole.

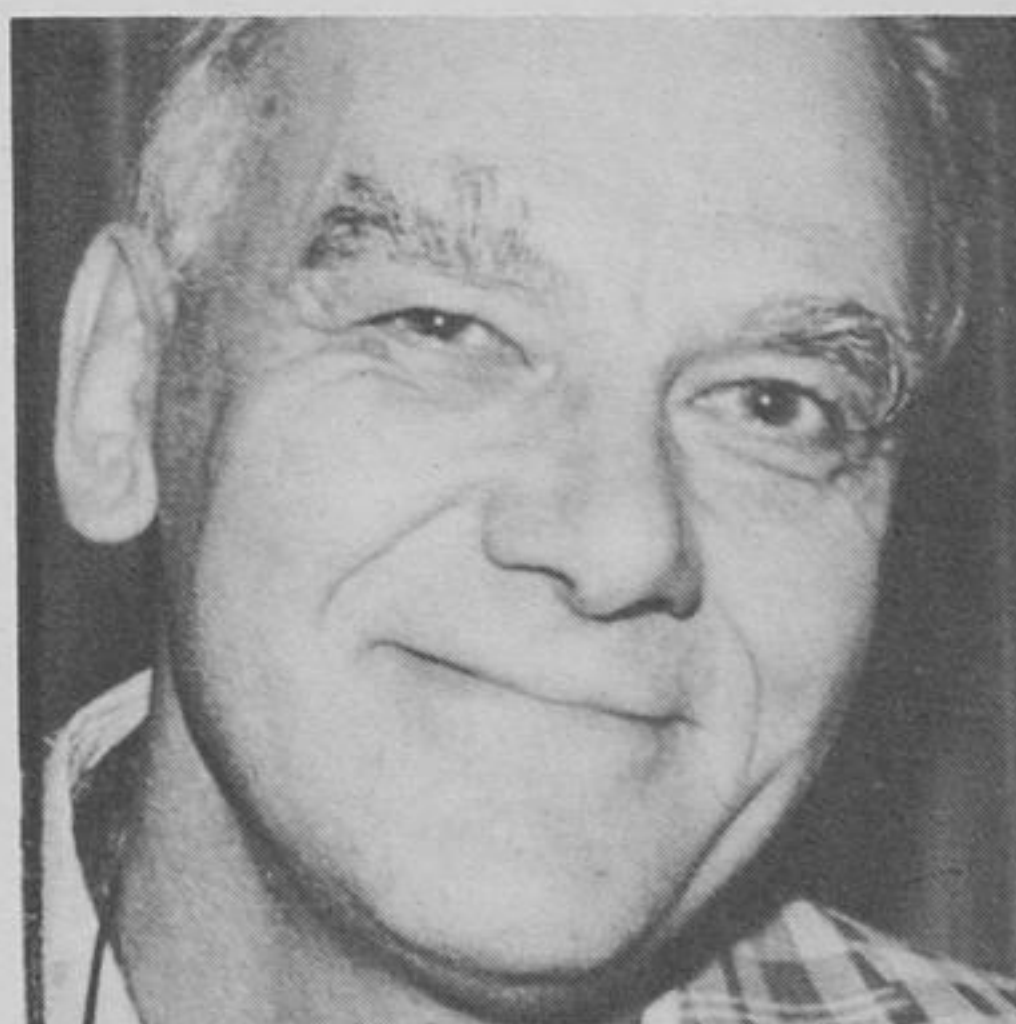
Soloist Chia-Yue, has been playing the piano since the age of four, winning the silver medal for top marks at the Royal Conservatory of Music seven years in a row.

The guest artist, who is now in his second year at the University of Toronto, where he is working on his bachelor of music in performance degree, will play Gershwin's Rhapsody in Blue, and Mendelssohn's Concerto in G Minor.

Conductor Poole is in his fourth year with the orchestra. When not on the podium, he is instructing at the conservatory and the U of T, as well as conducting the conservatory orchestra.

Peter Silverman, host of the Global TV program, Code 10-78, will be master of ceremonies.

Les Canadiens

Les Canadiens, an examination of the great Montreal hockey team in the days of Boom Boom Geoffrion, The Rocket et al, will be opening at Toronto Workshop Productions, Oct. 20 and continuing through to Nov. 19.

Written by Rick Salutin, "with an assist" from Montreal goalkeeper Ken Dryden, the musical play, which played to packed houses in Montreal last year, will present a bilingual version for Toronto audiences.

A musical documentary, Les Canadiens tells the history of the club and its heroes, their many great moments, and their role in the history of Quebec.

It also shows the impact Canada's national sport has on Canada's national unity.

A collaboration between writer Salutin and goalie Dryden, the play marks the return of its director, George Luscombe, to the Toronto stage for the first time in nearly two years.

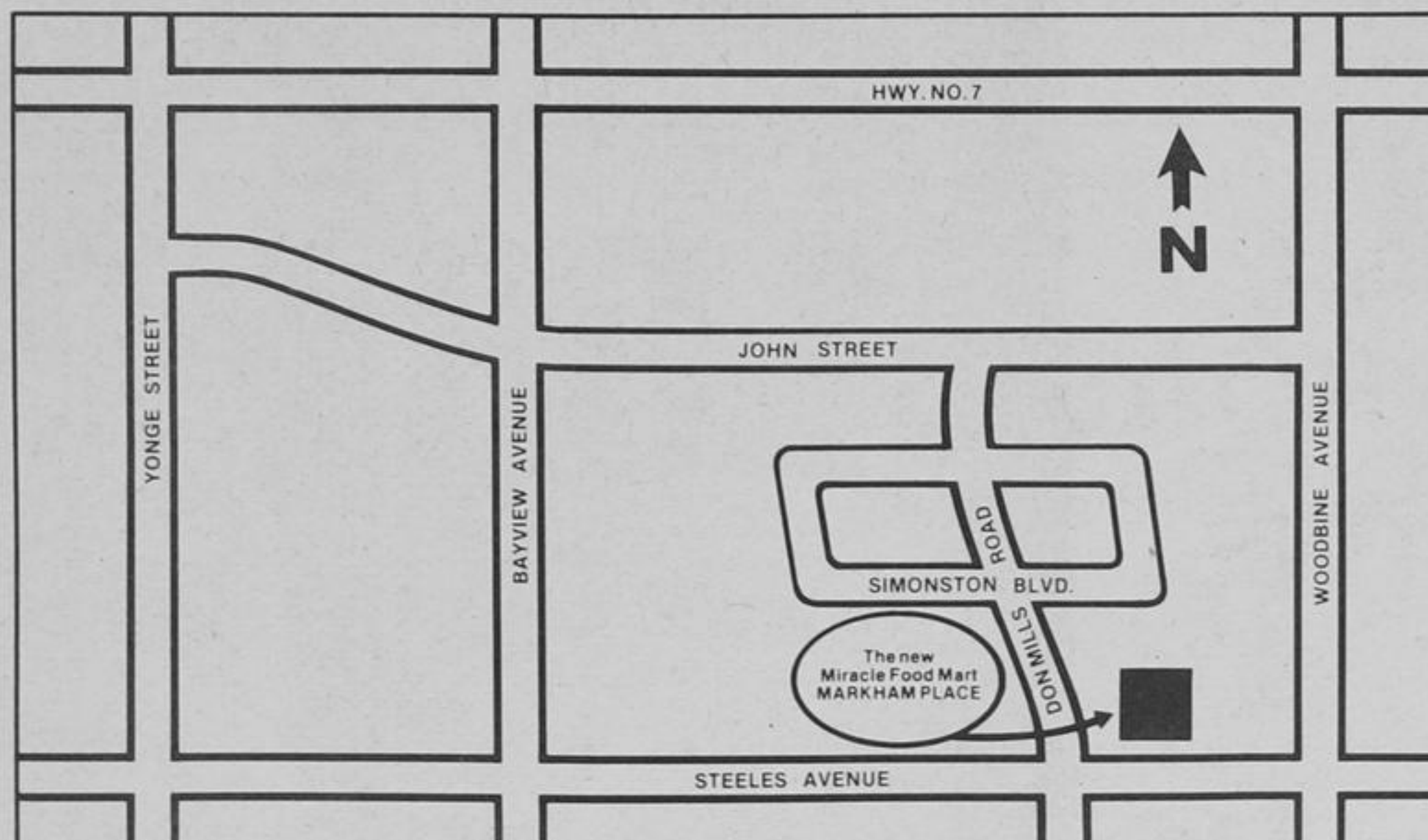
