# May renew special ed class in Kleinburg

A move to re-establish a special education class at Kleinburg Public School, will be made by York County Board of Education at its meeting Oct. 24.

The move, which was requested by Trustee Don

Cameron of Vaughan, was agreed to after the board had been visited by a delegation of parents at its regular meeting last week.

The parents, headed by Dr. Elizabeth O'Brien, appealed to the board to

re-open a junior diagnostic class at the school, which had been terminated Sept. 17, because the total enrolment was 13 short of the projected number.

According to the parents, the school principal said the board would have to reduce the teaching staff by one.

It would also be "logistically" easier to abolish the class, than to make new arrangements for a class of 30 or more students.

They were also told that arrangements would be made for the children to receive remedial help, or else attend the special education class in Pinegrove, three miles away.

In a petition presented to the board, the parents protested that they hadn't been consulted prior to

cancellation of the class.

They said, also, that Kleinburg needed a junior diagnostic class, and that the Pinegrove school "is evidently not suitable for the needs of at least some of the children" from the Kleinburg class.

Dr. O'Brien, who had a son in the class, stressed what she said was the importance of the children to integrate.

One of the best ways for that was at play.

However, if they were taken by bus to Pinegrove, they lost the best part of the day for integrating.

"The children are just baffled," she said.

Cameron's motion calls for the board to ask the director of education to re-establish the class "as soon as possible."
