## Royal Canadian Air Farce returns to Curtain Club

There'll be a handful of veterans and one newcomer in Richmond Hill Curtain Club's second play of the season, "The Day After the Fair."

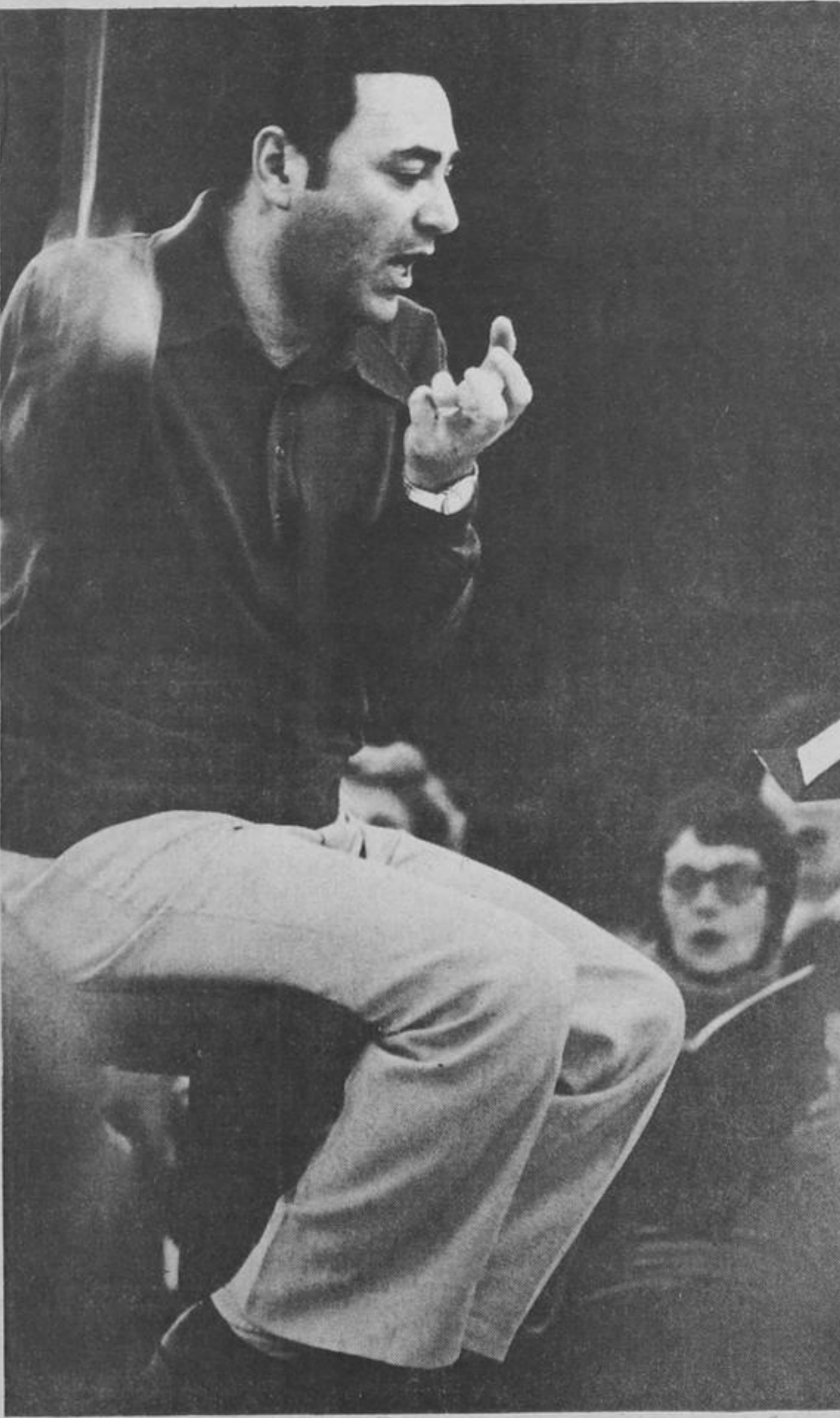
The play runs Nov. 25 to Dec. 10. David Phillips is the director, and Margot Crack the producer.

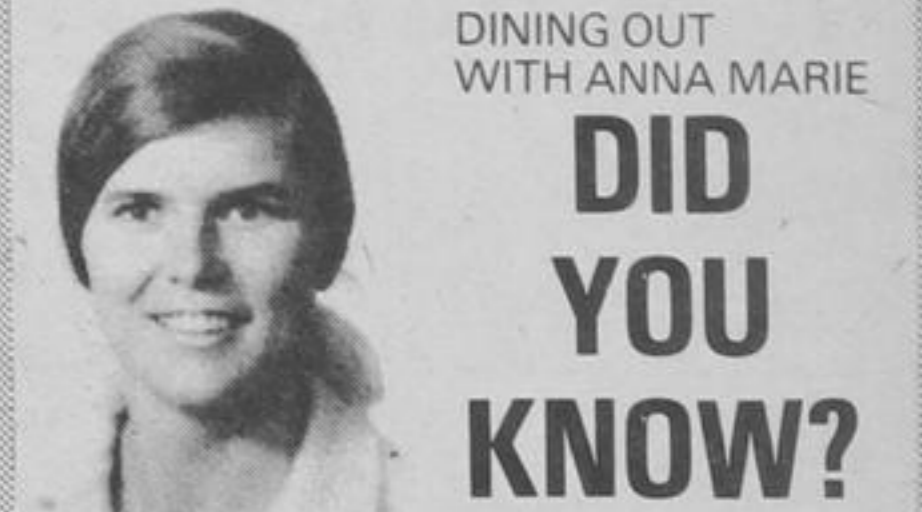
