

# Police charge man drove dangerously

A Weston youth was charged with dangerous driving after an incident in the Woodbridge High School parking lot last week.

Several other Vaughan drivers were charged after being stopped on local roads by York Regional Police. Giacomo Piro, 16, of Cabana Dr. will appear in provincial court Nov. 7 to face the dangerous driving charge.

Police were called at 2:45 p.m. Thursday to the high school after a car was seen being driven erratically. Meanwhile, a driver was stopped Friday at 12:50 a.m. on Kipling Avenue.

To appear in court Dec. 12 on charges of impaired driving and failing a breathalyzer test is James Soper, 24, of Simmonds Street, Woodbridge.

The same charges were laid against a driver stopped Sunday on Woodbridge Avenue at 2:30 a.m.

Another person was stopped Friday at 8:30 p.m. on Woodbridge Avenue and charged for driving with liquor open.

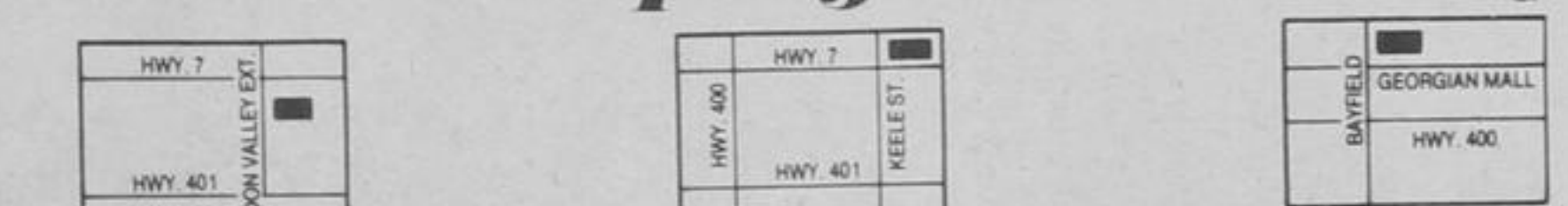

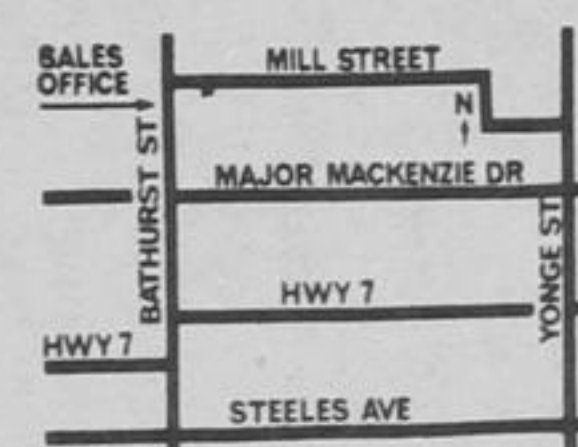
