The two were selected along with six other Ontario competitors following the recent Senior National Tournament held in Winnipeg. Ontario missed the gold

medal at the tournament by a narrow one-stroke margin losing 5-4 in penalty strokes to British Columbia.

Playing for the Canadian team, if they make it, won't be new for

either Sally Manning or Jean Gourlay.

Gourlay made the team last season and Manning is a seasoned veteran of Canadian teams having played on same for several seasons.

She has been to two World Tournaments with the team — New Zealand in 1971 and England in 1973.

Gourlay is an experienced veteran with Ontario teams but states

that "it's always a challenge to make the Canadian team."

"There's quite a difference when you're competing with 30 players from across the country." Both Gourlay and Manning have special

reasons for wanting to make the team this year.

They'll be selecting the team to represent Canada in a tournament in Australia next summer. "That's a nice place to be in the summer," says Gourlay.

The Skatathon will be held Oct. 29 between 9 a.m. and 5:30 p.m. in both the old and new arenas. Each player will, at his appointed time, attempt to skate 100 laps of the arena.

The Ladies' Auxiliary has been working on this skatathon since last May and June and the rest of us; players, coaches, parents and community have only a few more days to help out and do our share.
