The meeting sponsored by the parents of Royal Orchard begins at 8 p.m.

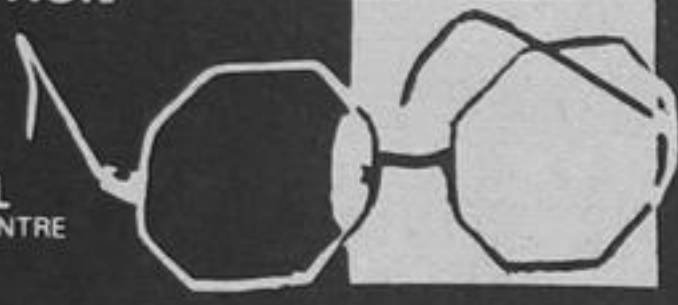

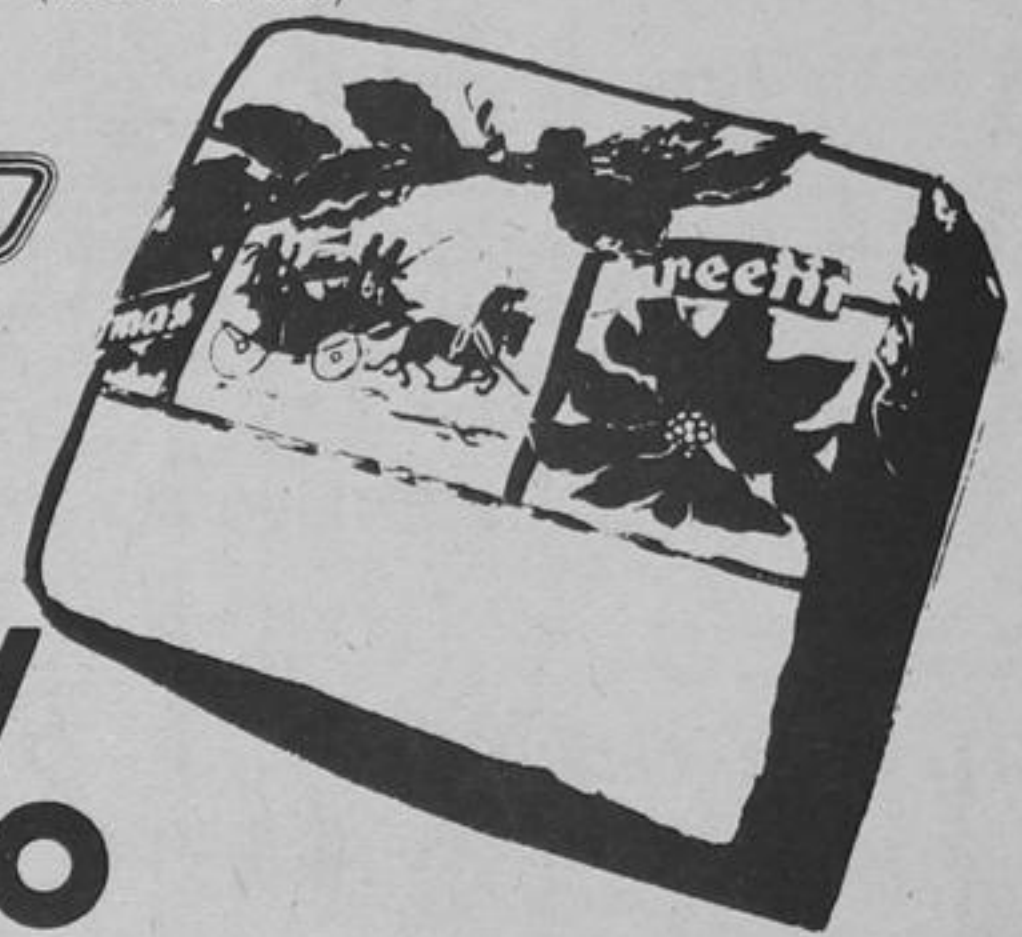

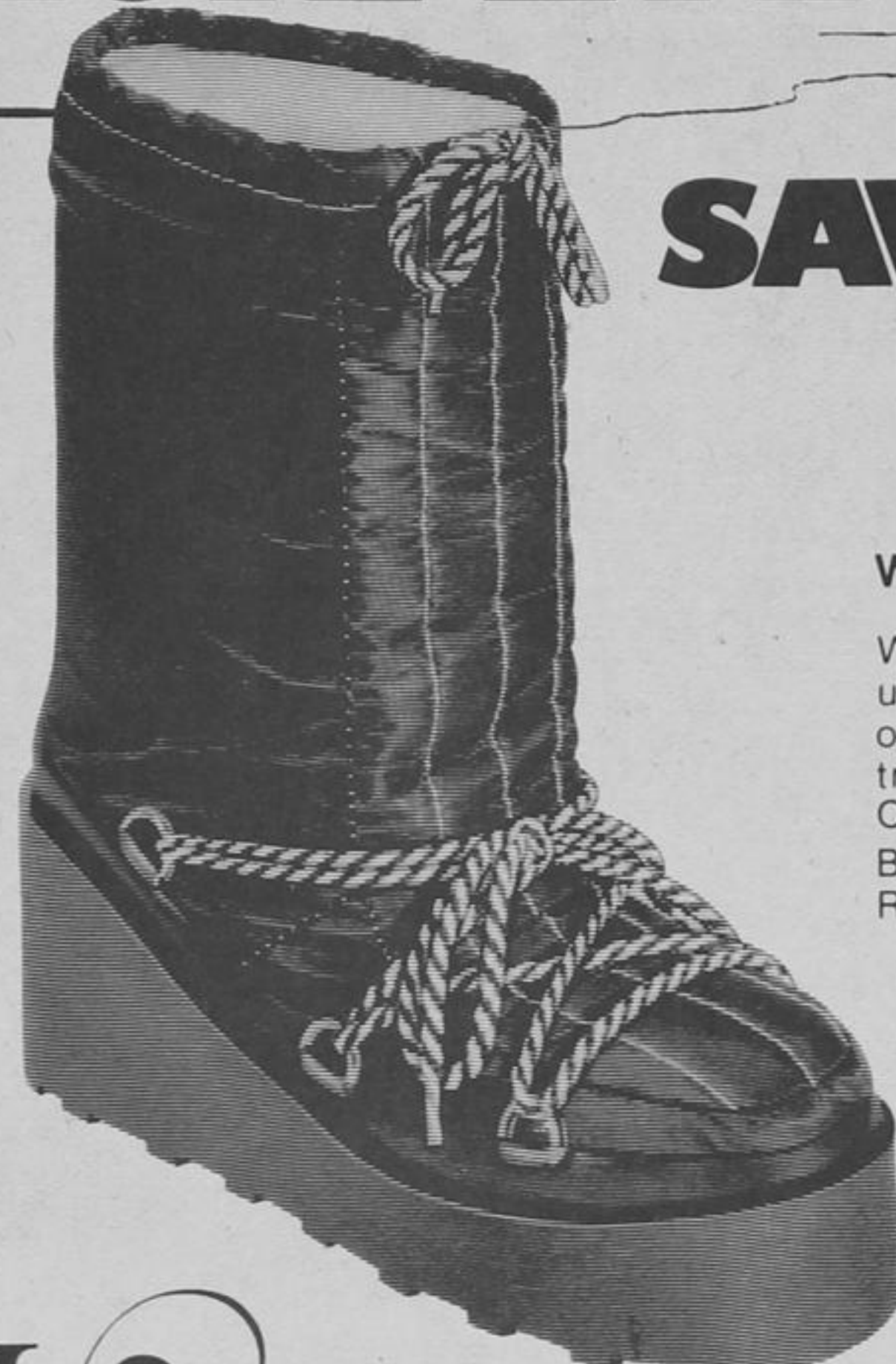
