Employees, friends and associates of Mr. Schoeler contributed to the fund, from which the annual accrued interest is being used to provide four substantial scholarships of equal value.

The winners must have contributed to the life of the school as well as having a consistently high academic record.

The awards were presented by Cathy Schoeler, a Thornhill student and daughter of the late Mr. Schoeler.

Maclellan also won the board of education award as the top student in the school graduating last year, an award for excellence in mathematics, algebra and was one of 23 Ontario scholars.

On Oct. 22, Thornhill Lions club President Lloyd Elvidge, along with Past Presidents Dennis Moore, Jack MacDonald, and Len Ehrlick as well as other members of the Lions, assembled at the Thornhill Community Centre on Bayview to place a plaque on a desk in the entrance commemorating the club's benefactor, Don Clifford.

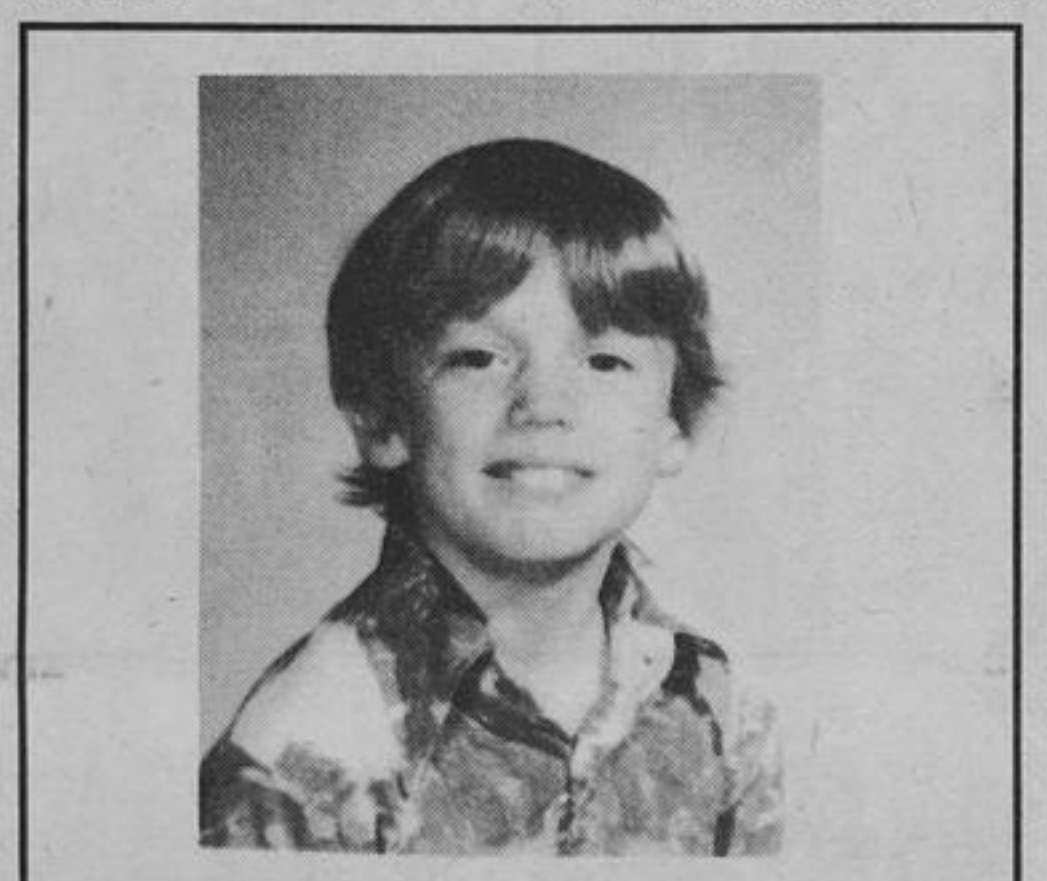

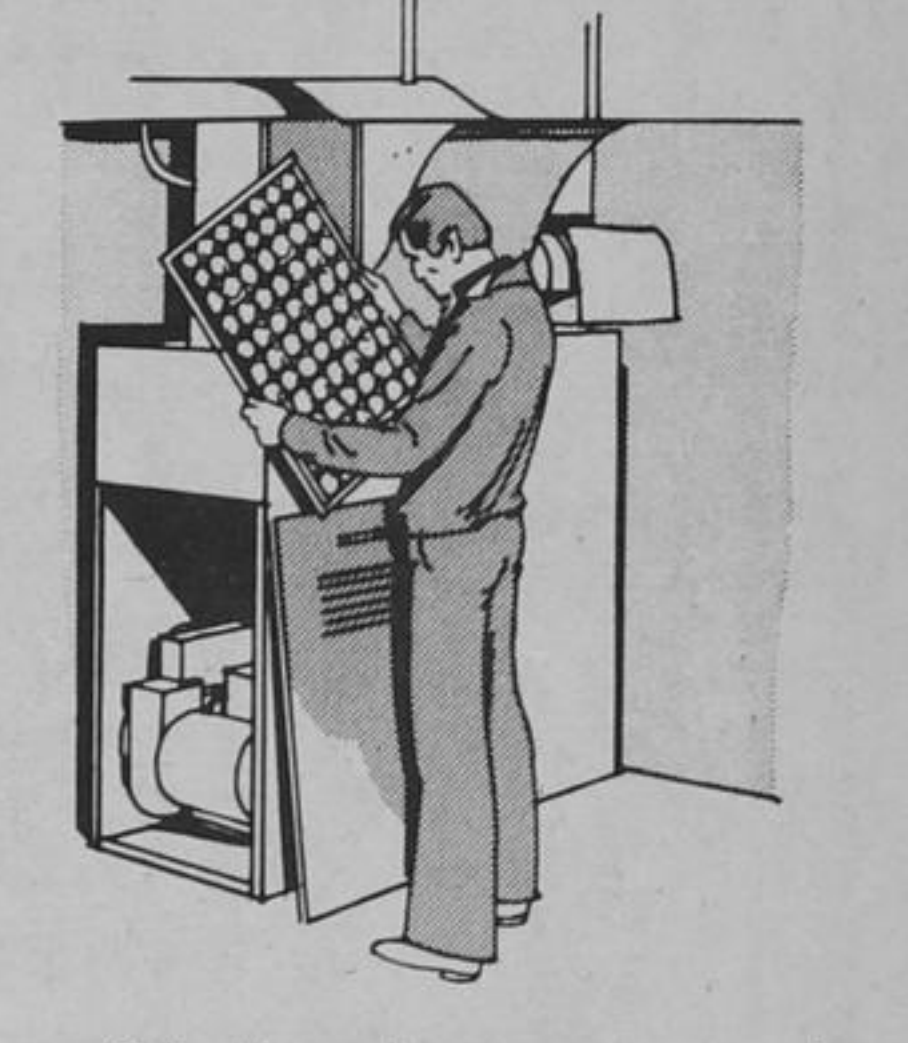

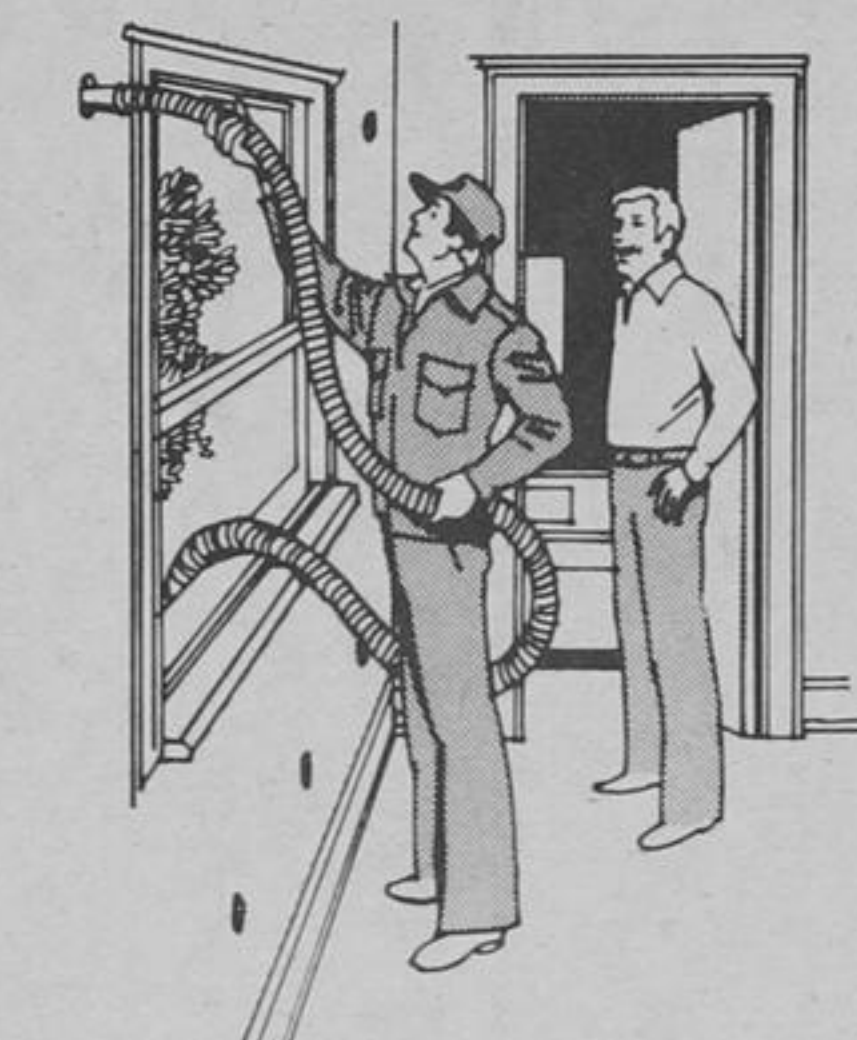
