A 40-year-old woman, who is leaving the Psychiatric Unit at York Central Hospital, needs a home.

David Burns, Community Coordinator of the Department of Psychiatry, made the plea this week.

The woman needs a place to live, on a long-term basis, where people are "warm and understanding", Mr. Burns said.

"A social worker from the hospital is willing to help make an arrangement with a homeowner work," he said.

"If a home is not found in the community, the only alternative is a long-term institutional placement," Mr. Burns said. "This is a sad alternative when all that is needed is 'the right kind of family'."


