"It was a team effort, we have no big stars," said Bayview coach Diane Martyn. She did acknowledge that "our defence was pretty good

all season." It was definitely good in the Georgian Bay championships last week against Banting Memorial of Alliston, Parry Sound, Thornhill.

The red-hot Bayview squad opened with a 5-0 blanking of Banting behind the three-goal scoring of Christine Peck. The other goals went to Catherine Rumney and Shelley Woloski.

Bayview then met and fought Parry Sound to a 0-0 draw before meeting with arch-rivals, Thornhill Secondary School. It was the same old story as Bayview shut out Thornhill 2-0 with Peck

scoring both goals.

A standout for Bayview in this game was goalie Ruth Ragan who came up with a great stop on a penalty shot to prevent what seemed a sure score. Also playing well was Ellen Fraser.

Despite the loss, Thornhill had an impressive tournament as they opened with a 2-1 win over Parry Sound with goals going to Sandra Colbourne and Joan Honsbourer.

They then tied Banting Memorial 0-0 before losing to Bayview in the final. Thornhill's record on the season was three wins, two losses, and four

ties. Prelude to Bayview winning the Georgian Bay laurels was an equally impressive York County championship victory by downing Newmarket 2-0 in the semi-finals. Then guess what?

Bayview tangled with Thornhill and won out by a narrow 1-0 margin with Rumney scoring the winning goal in the second half.

"It was a very exciting game," said Bayview coach Martyn. "It was also exciting beating out 15 other schools in the county for the championship."
