**Bad trick or amazing treat?**

**New TV program debuts Nov. 8 on Classicomm**

The York Region Chapter of the Association for Children with Learning Disabilities is starting a television series to debut Tuesday, November 8 at 7 p.m., on Classicomm's Channel 10.

The first half hour program deals with a general discussion of learning disabilities featuring Craig Shields of

the York Centre for Learning Disabilities; John Mcrae of the York Region Separate School Board; and Rosemary Underwood, Executive Director of Ontario ACLD.

On Tuesday, November 15, there will be a parents' panel, made up of parents of Learning Disabled kids, talking about educational problems and hopes for the future.

The third program, November 22, will be a panel of young people who will talk specifically about their learning disability handicap.

Laurie Leblanc of the York Centre will moderate that panel.

The final program, November 29 at 7 p.m. will be on juvenile delinquency and unchecked learning disabilities as a contributing factor.

Judge Terry Moore will be interviewed by Craig Shields and Rosemary Underwood.

All ex-service personnel are invited to take part in the march.

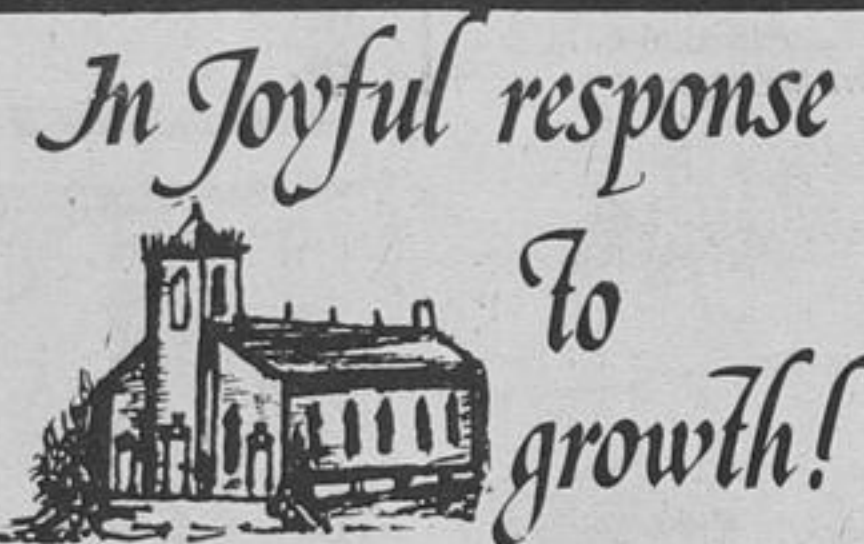
All citizens are urgently requested to attend this service.

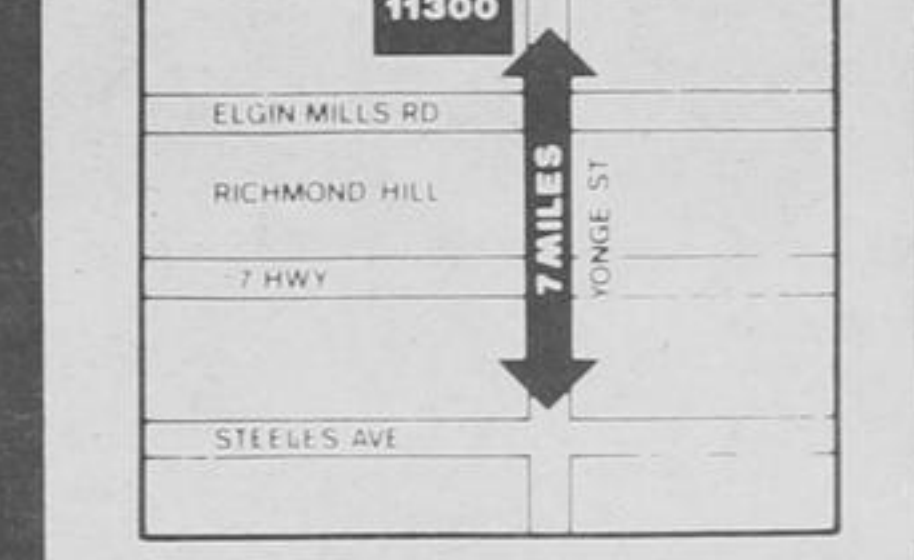
