Unwanted mediator appointed to deal with negotiations

Although neither side has requested it, a mediator has been appointed by the Education Relations Committee to

sit in on negotiations between York County Board of Education and its secondary school teachers.

The appointment of Toronto lawyer, Martin Teplitsky, came after release of a fact-finder's report on the salary issue.

The report recommended that increments be excluded from YCBE submissions to the Anti-Inflation Board with regard to salary increases.

The board is offering a six per cent increase, including increments, while the teachers want nine per cent, with increments out.

The report stated the board's offer was too low and the teachers' demand was too high.

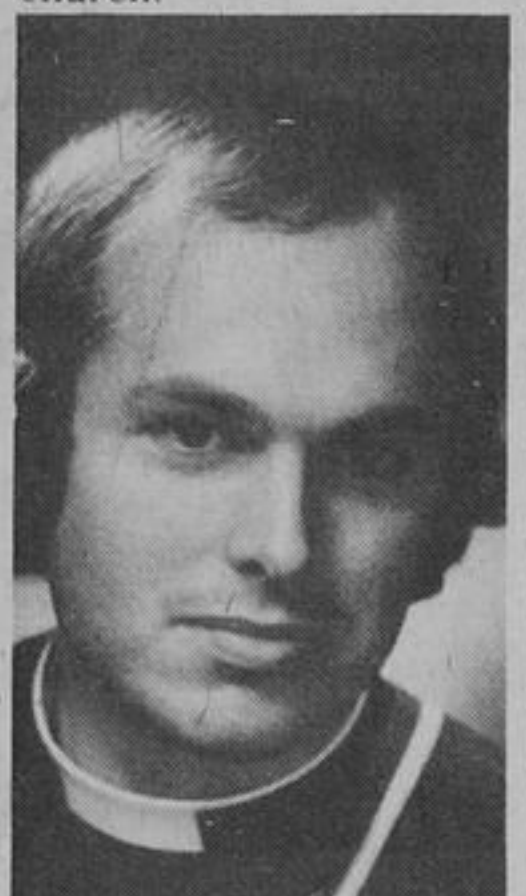
Mr. Arthur was pronounced dead at the scene by Coroner Dr. Bernard Granton.

Police briefs

York Regional Police have charged two men with armed robbery and extortion, as a result of another man being abducted from his Woodbridge motel last week.

According to police, Charles Hoskinson had been in his room at Aloha Inn Motel, Highway 7, Nov. 11, about 8 p.m., when two men burst in and demanded \$2,000, which they said was owed to them.

Police said that Hoskinson refused to give them any money, and one of the men then drew a butcher knife and threatened him with it.

After searching him, the men took him at knife point to the residence of the assistant manager of his bank.

They then tried to get the latter to open the bank, so that their hostage could withdraw his money, police said.

When that failed, they took the man back to his motel, where they got \$300 cash from him, police said.

They also forced him to endorse two pay cheques for \$300 and another cheque for \$1,400.

Subsequently arrested were John Boni, 20, and Tony Boni, 24, both of Downsview.

NOT FOR LONG

A Woodbridge man caught two would-be robbers in the act last week, but he wasn't able to keep them for long.

Domenico Lecce, Woodbridge Avenue, told police that he locked two men in his upstairs bedroom when he surprised them there on

arriving home, about 2:20 p.m., November 10.

However, while calling police, the men made their escape through a window.

The men, one white and the other black, were said to be about 25, six feet tall; and five feet, eight inches, respectively.

LEST WE FORGET

Remembrance Day was one to remember in Richmond Hill, but it was for a different kind of fighting.

Police said that a brawl, that started in Richmond Hill Inn and then broke out anew on the parking lot outside, sent three people to York County Hospital, where it started up again.

A Richmond Hill taxi driver, Roy Clark of Oxford Street, suffered a broken nose, after being struck by one of the tavern fighters, who had cut himself when he smashed a door on exiting, police said.

An argument over Clark taking him to hospital, resulted in one of the other celebrants breaking two windows in the cab, police said.

At the hospital, the two men and another member of the group, started fighting again, according to police.

Facing charges of assault occasioning bodily harm, mischief, causing a disturbance and assault with intent to resist arrest, are Gerald Basnicki, 23, and Anthony Basnicki, 18, both of Brampton; and William Stavro, 18, of Etobicoke.
