Scarboro came out flying in the third period but Ben Fourget turned aside 10 shots before they scored with 16 minutes left in the game.

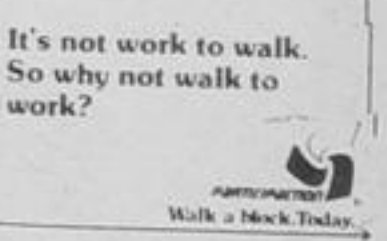
TIE IT
