Let school board build fence - mayor

York Regional Council, which has often been accused of sitting on the fence, did its best last week to see that there wasn't going to be one there to begin with.

At least in the matter of school sites. Council approved a subdivision plan in the Town of Markham, but refused to be fenced in by a proposal from York County Board of Education that required the developer to build a nine-strand page-wire fence with gates on the street frontage on all sides of the school site.

The fence was to be "maintained in good condition" throughout construction and then be replaced by a permanent chain link fence, six feet high.

Newmarket Mayor Bob Forhan led the fight. "If the board wants to build a fence, let them do it," he said.

The school site was board property and it wasn't the region's responsibility to negotiate for the fence. The site covers 350 acres, between Warden, Steeles and 14th Avenues, and Birchmount Road. Expected population in the area is 2,500. Council agreed that the subdivision agreement between the owner and the municipality "shall contain a provision for adequate fencing of the school site."

TRAFFIC ROUTE
In another action, council agreed to ask the provincial government to "protect and designate" the proposed right-of-way for the East Metro transportation corridor.

Frank Norman of the Ministry of Transportation, who sought council's support in the plan to protect the corridor from Highway 401 to Highway 7, said it would be 16 years before such a road would be constructed.

However, a designated route to assist in its development was needed. In approving the request, council suggested that establishment of the proposed route of the highway north of No. 7, as well, would aid regional development.
