1. The Council of The Corporation of the Town of Vaughan intends to apply to The Ontario Municipal Board for approval to construct a works yard complex consisting of a garage, office space, parking lot, gasoline tanks and storage facilities at an estimated cost of \$500,000.00 The sum of \$100,000 was allocated for this purpose out of lot levies received by the Corporation and the balance of \$400,000.00 shall be raised by the sale of debentures, which will be repayable over a term of ten (10) years.

2. Application will be made to The Ontario Municipal Board for an order to dispense with the assent of the electors to the undertaking of the said works. Any ratepayer may, within twenty-one days after the first publication of this notice which is December 14th, 1977, send by post prepaid to the Clerk of the Town of Vaughan, at the address given below, a notice in writing stating his objection to such ap-
