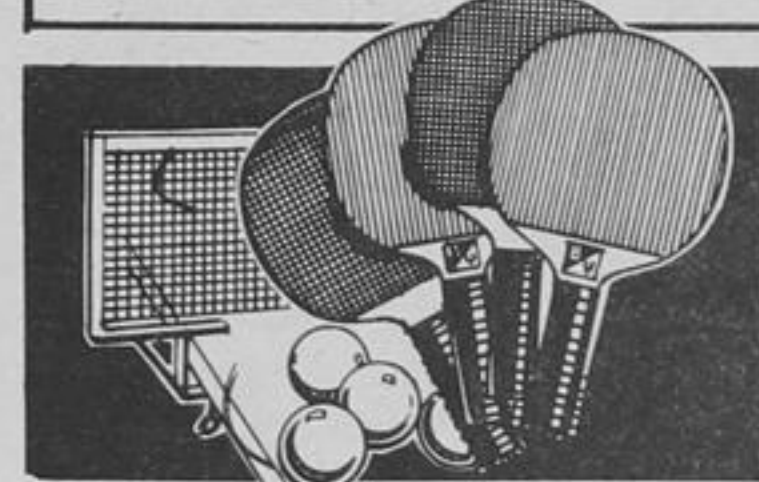

Committee of Adjustment Jurisdiction
To hear applications for minor variances to the Zoning By-laws of the Town and to rule on the legalization of each as provided under The Planning Act of Ontario.
Remuneration: \$25.00 per meeting
Appointments: One member for a 3 year term.

Parks and Recreation Committee Jurisdiction
To assist in the development and to recommend to Council policies which will improve the parks and recreation services of the municipality.
Appointments: Six in all, preferably one from each Ward.

Special Note: The six resident members will be joined by five members of Council (including the Mayor) to comprise a Committee of eleven. The Chairman and Vice-Chairman of the Committee will be a member of Council other than the Mayor.

Civic Improvement Committee Jurisdiction
To assist in the development and to recommend to Committees of Council policies which will improve the physical and cultural amenities of the municipality.
Appointments: Twelve in all, preferably two from each Ward, with a minimum of four appointments to persons not presently sitting as members.

Library Board Jurisdiction
To serve as representative of the Municipality on the Library Board.
Appointments: One member for a 3 year term.

Property Standards Committee Jurisdiction
To hear appeals made against orders of the Property Standards Officer and to confirm, quash or modify the officer's order.
Appointments: One member for a 3 year term.

Local Architectural Conservation Advisory Committee Jurisdiction
To identify buildings of historic or architectural significance and to recommend to Council their designation as such under the Heritage Act of Ontario.
Appointments: A minimum of 5 members are required for a 1 year term.
