They are Notre Dame in Newmarket, Rogers Public School in Newmarket, Sharon Public School, Meadowbrook School in Newmarket, King City Public School, Devins Drive Public School in Aurora, Aurora Heights Public School, Keswick Public School, St. Peter's Separate School in Woodbridge and Newmarket High School. The schools participate in several ways. In some cases an entire school is involved in a fund raising program and in others it's by individual classrooms. In Meadowbrook Public School the students had to earn the money they contributed. At Notre Dame the primary, intermediate and senior departments along with

the staff each took one family and each classroom looks after one member of the family. The students also do the planning, shopping and wrapping of the gifts. Lynn Robertson of Family and Children's Services says the program is successful for the families, who are clients of the organization, and for the students who contribute.

She feels the kids are really benefitting by helping someone else at Christmas. They must also enjoy it, for some schools are back for the third year. Businesses have also gotten into the act. Contributions have come from the Needlework Guild in Toronto, a men's wear store in Aurora and a large department store donates money every

year. Some members of its staff shop for and donate food. For the past two years turkeys have been donated by a television station in Toronto and there are many private families who have cut back on their own giving to provide for a needy family. A Brownie pack in Richmond Hill has contributed candies and a

marriage encounter group has supplied books, hobbies and games. Even the York Regional Police Auxiliary Association is joining the program this year. Although the program is held in December, the planning begins months in advance and according to Mrs. Robertson has "snowballed every year". The operation is run by volunteers. 


