forbids such action which endangers the life or health of any child under the age of 10 years. Parents are also reminded that under certain conditions a Christmas tree can be ignited by a single match to burn furiously to charred wood in

a few seconds. Care must be taken to keep butts of natural trees immersed in water and to ensure that the tree itself does not obstruct access to a door or window.

Families also are urged to review their home fire-escape plans for a quick exit in an emergency.


