 About \$2,500 was collected in a runathon held recently at German Mills Public School. Over 300 students participated and the students were sponsored per lap. All funds will be used for the

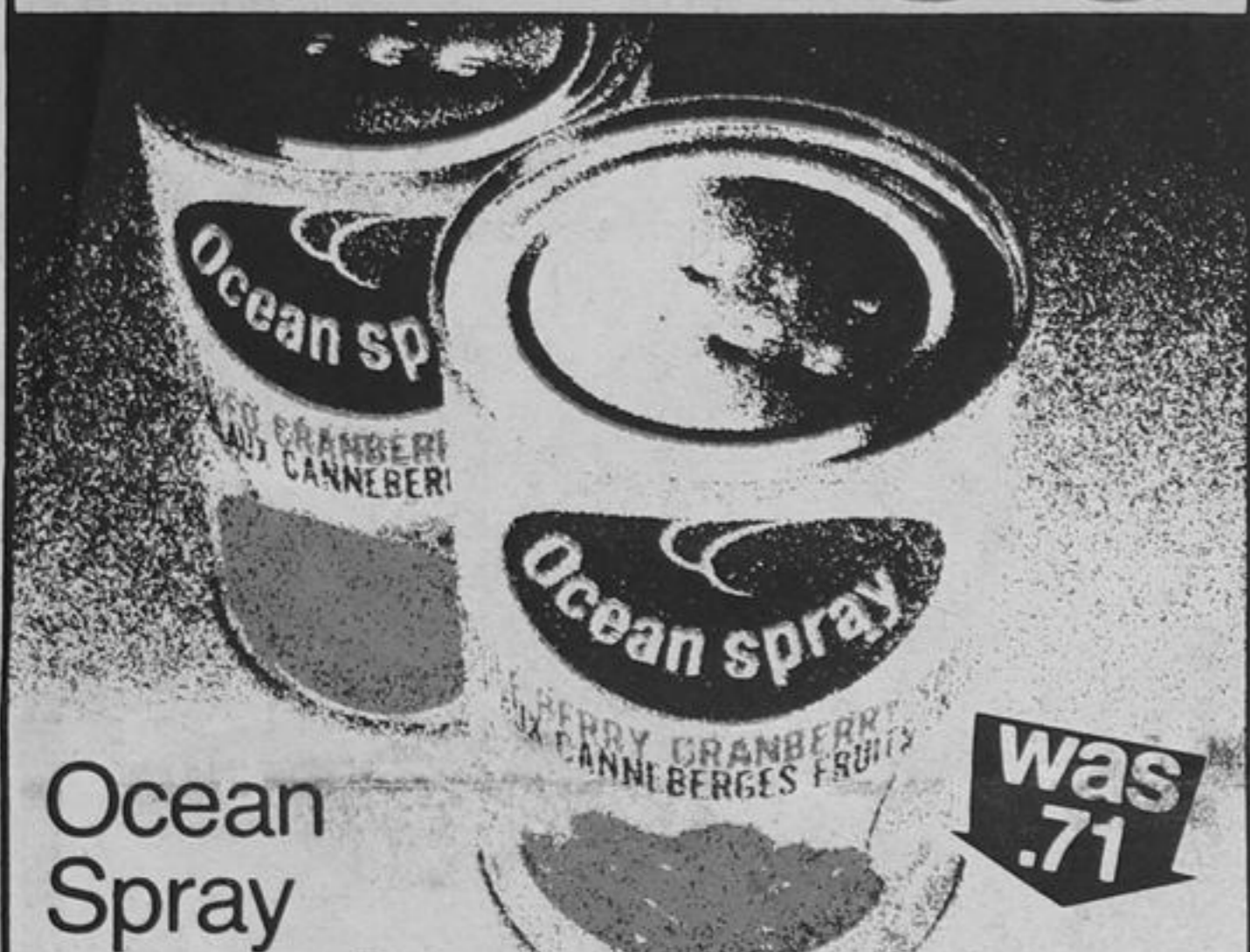
beautification of the school as well as other worthwhile school projects as suggested by the students. To date funds were used to rent buses for a field trip to Pioneer Village for Grade 2 students.

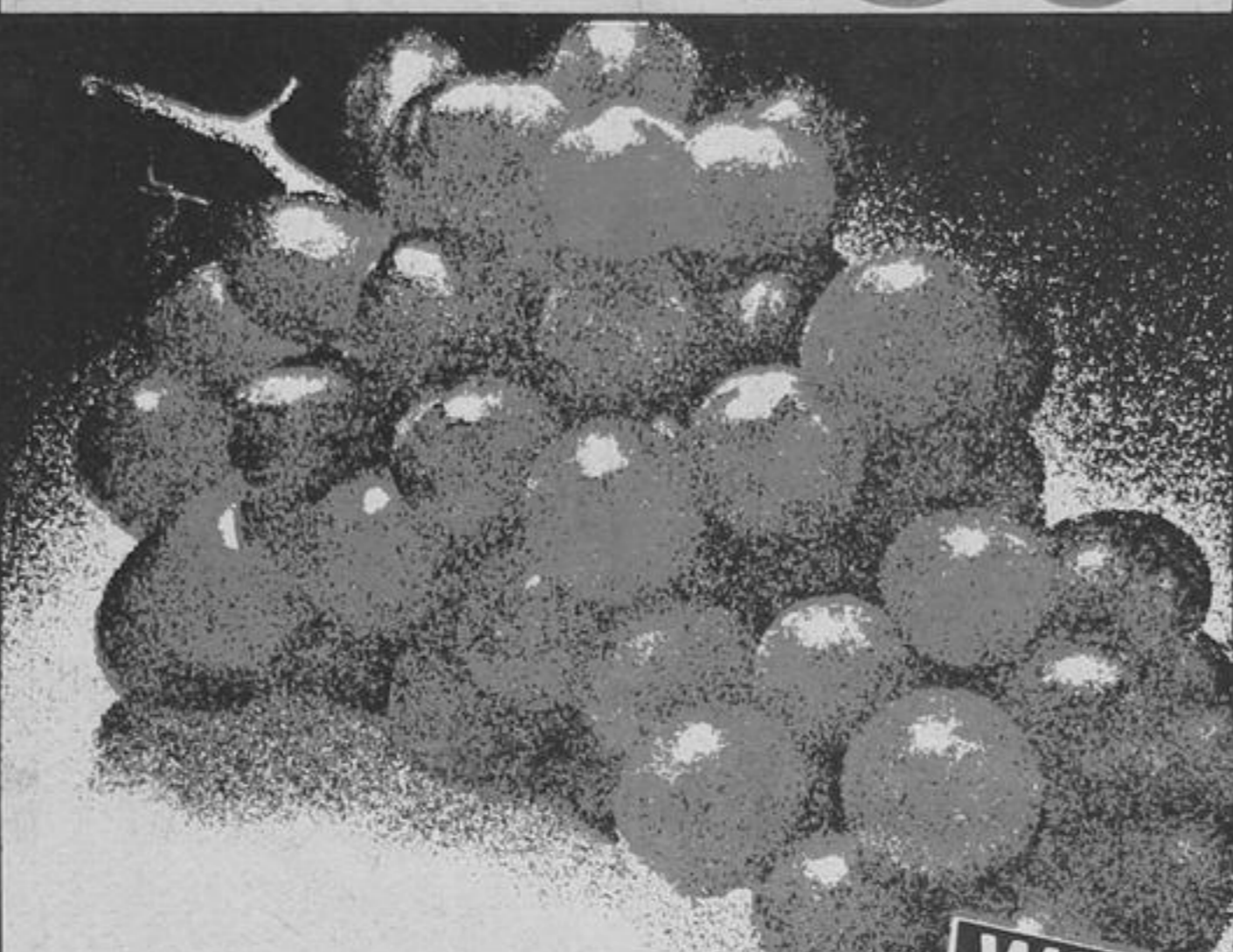
