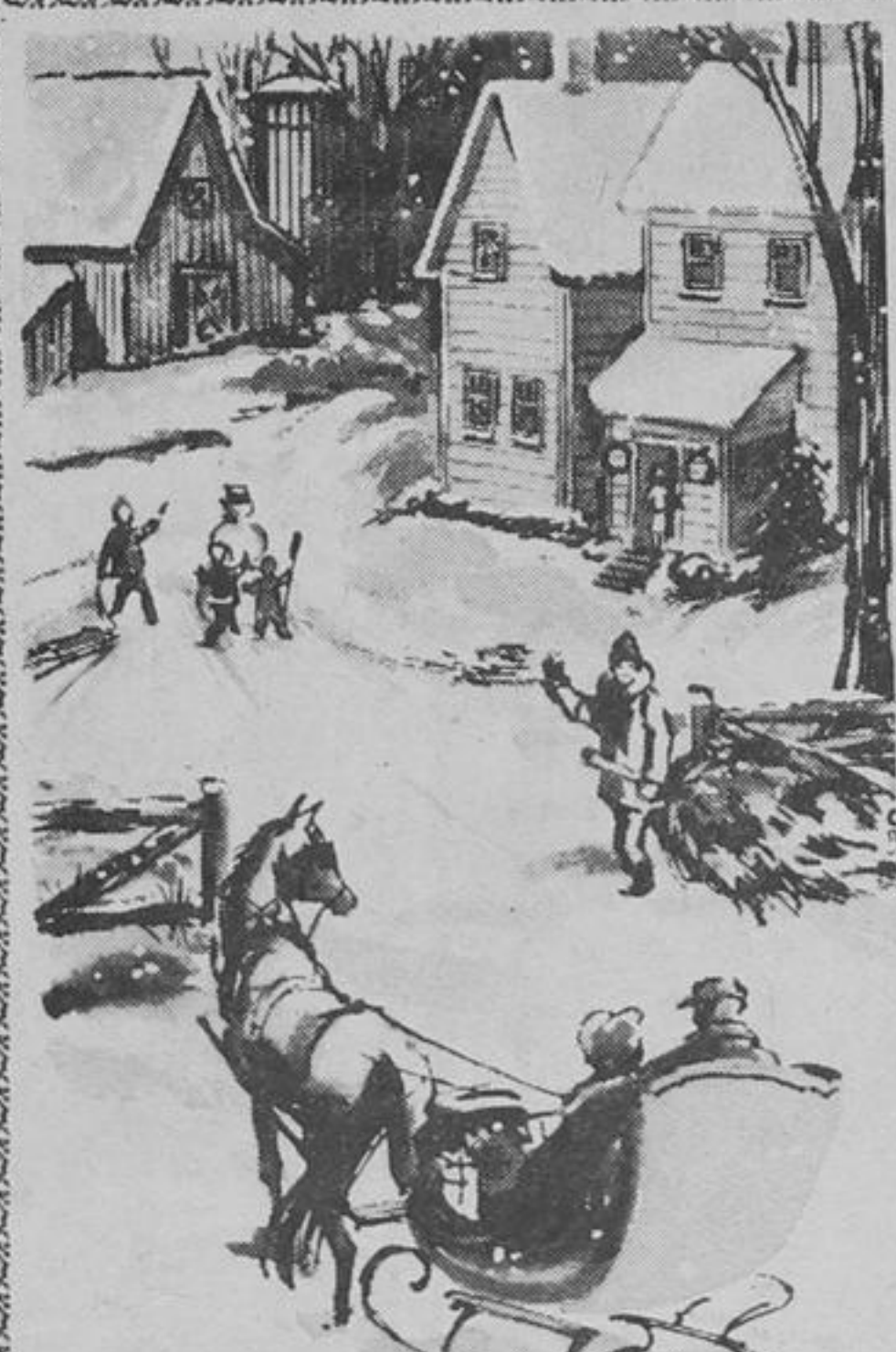

TOWN OF VAUGHAN

TAKE NOTICE THAT

1. The Council of The Corporation of the Town of Vaughan intends to construct sanitary sewers, the necessary appurtenances thereto, and private sewer connections on:

- (a) **HIGHWAY #7** - south side only - from Baldwin Avenue to a point 977.85 feet westerly,
- (b) **HILLSIDE AVENUE** - from Highway #7 to Baldwin Avenue,
- (c) **ROCKVIEW GARDENS** - from Keele Street to its easterly limit in Registered Plan 2468,
- (d) **SOUTHVIEW DRIVE** - north side - from Keele Street to Baldwin Avenue, - south side - from Keele Street to a point 319.0 feet east of the east limit of Keele Street,
- (e) **BALDWIN AVENUE** - from Southview Drive to Highway #7,
- (f) **KEELE STREET** - east side only - from Southview Drive to a point approximately 615.0 feet north of Rockview Gardens,

as a local improvement and intends to specially assess a part of the cost upon land abutting directly on the work.

2. The estimated cost of the work is \$577,467.00 of which \$40,069.00 is to be paid by the Corporation and it is anticipated that \$273,758.00 is to be paid by a developer of lands on the south side of Southview Drive. On that basis the estimated cost per foot frontage is \$12.70 and the estimated cost of each private sewer connection is \$587.10. The special assessment is to be paid in twenty (20) annual installments and the annual cost of the sewers is \$1.49 per foot frontage and of the service connection is \$68.96.

In the event that the developer's contribution is not finalized Council could not proceed with the work until a revised notice is served upon you. The approval of the Ontario Municipal Board to the construction of the works is required.

3. Persons desiring to petition against undertaking the work must do so on or before the 16th day of January, 1978.
