
COUNCIL CHAMBERS, MUNICIPAL BUILDING, BUTTONVILLE A Public Hearing will be held by the Planning Committee of the Town of Markham Council to consider an amendment to the Official Plan of the Markham Planning Area for Part Lot 19, Concession 4. the subject property (Seagram Estates) comprises some 39 acres, located immediately south of the existing Cachet Country Club development shown on the map below.

The subject lands are presently covered by Official Plan Amendment No. 16 (Secondary Plan for the Devil's Elbow Community) which requires development to occur with lots having a minimum area of two acres and a school site location on the subject property.

The purpose of this amendment is to permit a proposed plan of subdivision with lots having a minimum area of one acre each. In addition it is proposed to delete the location of the school site.

You are invited to attend the Hearing and to state your support of or objection to the proposed amendment. Should you be unable to attend, written submissions will be received up to the time of the Hearing. The proposed amendment, the Official Plan, and existing land use maps may be examined at the Planning Office.
