Willow Brook area ready for action

Residents of the newest section of Thornhill are forming their own association.

Houses first started going into the Willow Brook area east of Thornlea Secondary School two years ago and new residents were confronted with the usual problems of no schools, social or recreational facilities that they could call their own.

There is no letter carrier delivery either. From the number of corner mail boxes, it was determined that 500 families have moved into the area.

About a third of them were represented at the first meeting of the Willow Brook ratepayers held recently at Thornlea.

The group at first intended to include only the residents of the immediate area but have found they have been joined by new residents of adjacent areas.

Chief instigator of the group and the first president is Geri Berholz. There are two vice

presidents, Meredith Coristine and Simar Gelman.

Treasurer is Mr. Peter Taylor and secretary is Mr. Arthur Donin.

The board of directors is composed of the chairmen of the committees. They are: Janet Goodman, Social and Recreation Chairman; Mort Goldstein, Community Services; Nate Falter, Constitution Committee; Susan Reid, Brownies; and in the Children Concerns Committee there are four sub-committees whose chairmen are Carole Tator, Barbara Nollins, Yunus Desai and Carol Beevers. Harry Berholz is Public Relations Chairman while establishing the 10th District Cubs and Beavers.

A Home and School Association will soon be formed in conjunction with Henderson School, now attended by many of the Willow Brook Community children.

On June 4, the Willow Brook Association plans a Huge Garage Sale with June 11 the alternate date in case of rain. There will also be an accompanying Auction Sale and of course, a Bake Sale. All proceeds are to be used for the new community's activities.

Councillor Stan Daurio said that the new association is a great asset to the community of Willow Brook and pledged his co-operation. He also stated that the Playground Equipment will likely be installed in Willow Brook Park this year.

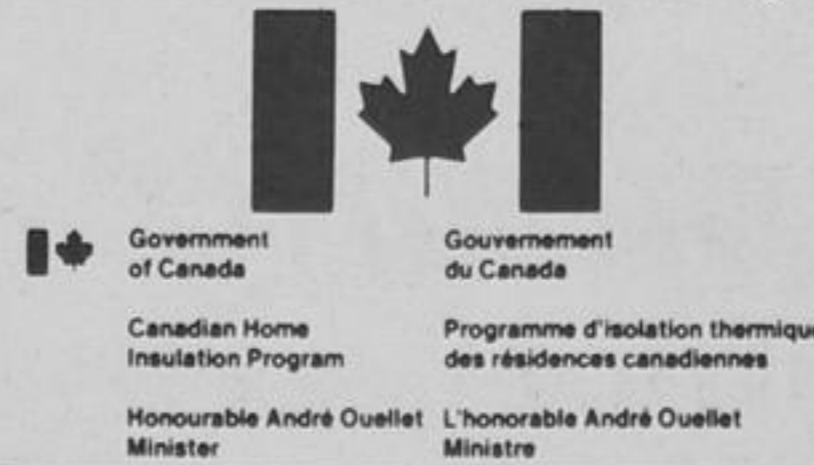

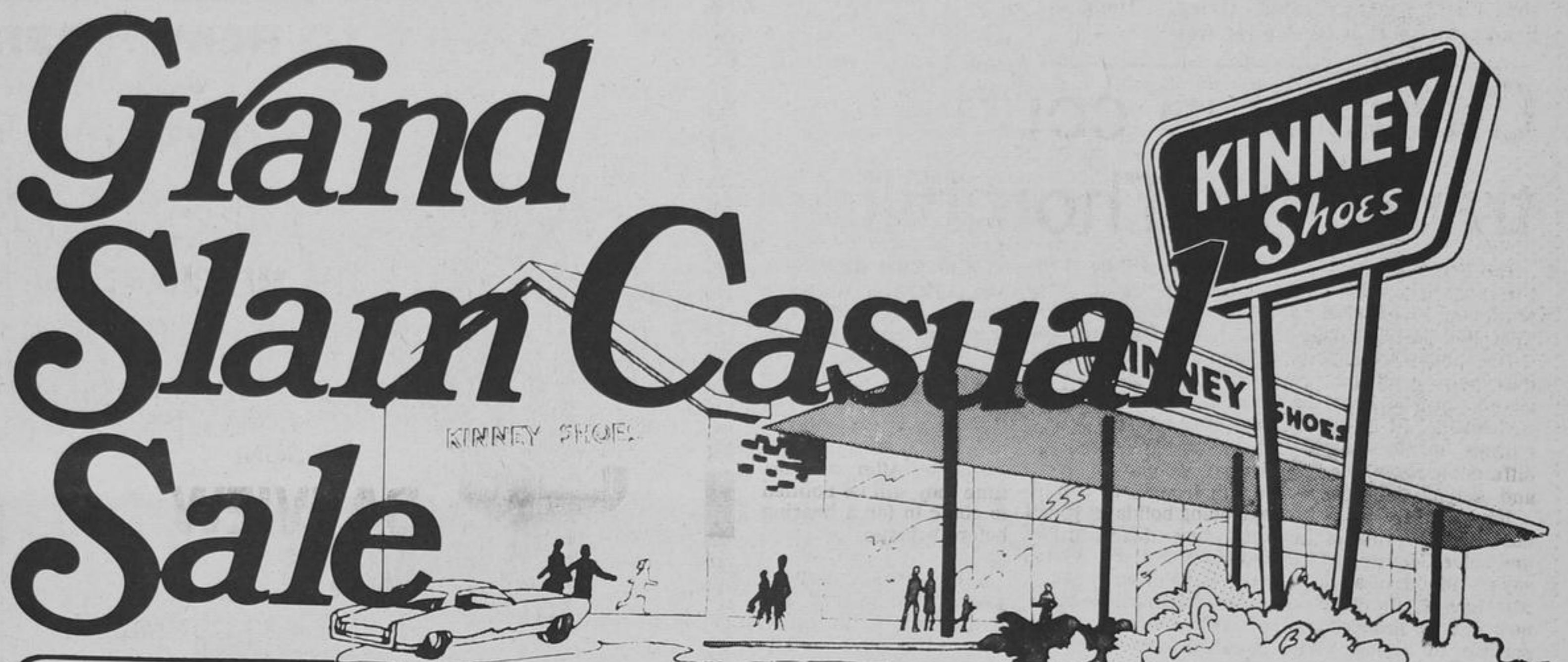

COUNCIL CHAMBERS, MUNICIPAL BUILDING, BUTTENVILLE
A Public Hearing will be held by the Planning Committee of the Town of Markham Council to consider an amendment to the Official Plan of the Markham Planning Area for Part Lot 19, Concession 4, the subject property (Seagram Estates) comprises some 39 acres, located immediately south of the existing Cachet Country Club development shown on the map below.

The subject lands are presently covered by Official Plan Amendment No. 16 (Secondary Plan for the Devil's Elbow Community) which requires development to occur with lots having a minimum area of two acres and a school site location on the subject property.

The purpose of this amendment is to permit a proposed plan of subdivision with lots having a minimum area of one acre each. In addition it is proposed to delete the location of the school site.

You are invited to attend the Hearing and to state your support of or objection to the proposed amendment. Should you be unable to attend, written submissions will be received up to the time of the Hearing. The proposed amendment, the Official Plan, and existing land use maps may be examined at the Planning Office.
