Family is a support group

Dad's at an election convention for the weekend, mum's at a conference somewhere else, son is camping with his scout troop, and daughter's at rehearsals for an upcoming concert.

Who's going to feed the dog? Sound familiar? With all the activities and organizations available in our community, the family is fractured by the individual interests of its members.

And yet at the same time the family is one of the most integrating forces in our society.

The family provides roots; it's a support group in time of crisis; it's a community of acceptance and reassurance and love.

The Richmond Hill and Thornhill Family Services Association has brought the needs of the family to our attention recently with their Family Week.

How do we extend this emphasis in our daily lives?

One family spent a year abroad studying together for four hours a day.

One hour they might study Grade 3 math together; another they might spend on junior high history; another they might help the father with his professional development; another they might help the mother with the book she was writing.

At the end of the year the family had grown much closer together and, incidentally, the children had advanced two or three years in school.

Most of us can't take a year away from work, but all of us can establish family times together and give these times priority in our planning.

And the churches can help us here too.

The church is a natural support to the family and provides an opportunity for the family to worship together, to enjoy fellowship together, and to learn together.

Some of our local churches are grouping together families and single people to re-create the extended family of the past, where, as in the television program "The Waltons", people of every age might relate closely

TOWN OF VAUGHAN NOTICE TO PROPERTY OWNERS TO DESTROY NOXIOUS WEEDS

Notice is hereby given to every person in possession of land within the Town of Vaughan, in accordance with The Weed Control Act, Ontario, that unless noxious weeds or weed seeds are destroyed by June 1st, 1978, and throughout the season, the Municipality may enter upon said lands to cause the noxious weeds or weed seeds to be destroyed, charging the costs against the land in taxes as set out in the Act.

In the interest of public health, noxious weeds requiring eradication as they appear are Goat's-Beard, Chicory, Thistles, Ragweed, Poison Ivy, Wild Carrot, etc.

Although Dandelions, Burdock and Goldenrod are not considered noxious weeds within the Town of Vaughan under The Weed Control Act, the co-operation of all citizens is solicited in the elimination of these nuisance weeds.

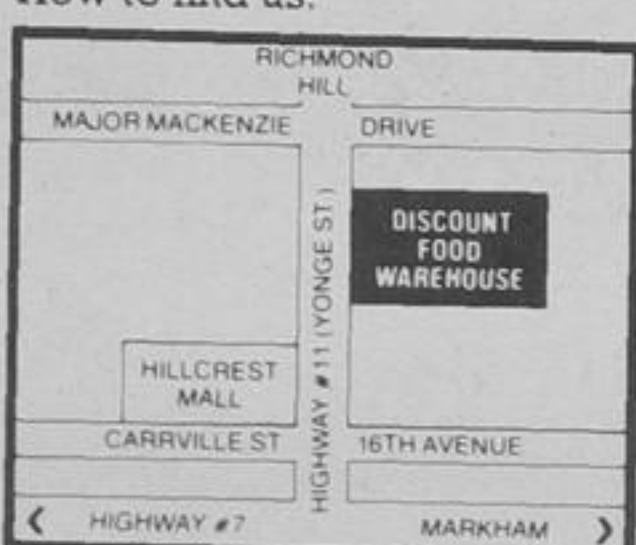
