**\$80,000 for Library**

## Wintario dumps \$\$ into York Region

Wintario Draw proceeds continue to assist organizations in York Region.

Recently, grants totalling \$107,114 were approved for 18 projects in the Region.

The grants range from \$80,201 to \$169.

The largest went to the Richmond Hill Public Library to aid in the costs of installing facilities which will ensure access for the physically handicapped.

The Corporation of the Town of Markham will use a grant of \$11,102 to assist with the purchase of fitness equipment.

Back in Richmond Hill,

a grant of \$4,500 will go to the Richmond Hill Minor Soccer Club to defray the costs of travel for the Minor Mosquito team and the Minor Pee wee Team, when they attended a Florida tournament last year.

The Bantam boys' team of the Richmond Hill Minor Soccer Club gets \$1,500 to aid in the costs of travel incurred when they went to an invitational meet in Ireland.

The Richmond Hill Magna Midgets hockey team gets \$1,500 for travel assistance to attend an invitational tournament in Brandon, Manitoba.

Richmond Hill's

Hillcrest Residents' Association will get \$1,353 to help purchase recreation equipment and a piano.

The Thornhill Minor Pee wee hockey team is to receive a grant of \$1,270 for travel assistance to a tournament in Winnipeg.

A grant of \$1,250 is to be made to the Town of Markham to assist with the purchase of mats for a gymnastics program.

The Markham Men's Fun League will get \$647 to help purchase softball equipment.

A grant of \$465 will be made to the Markham Pee wee Hockey Team for travel assistance to a

tournament in Quebec City.

The Richmond Hill Major Midgets get \$457 to help in the costs of a tournament in Drummondville, Quebec.

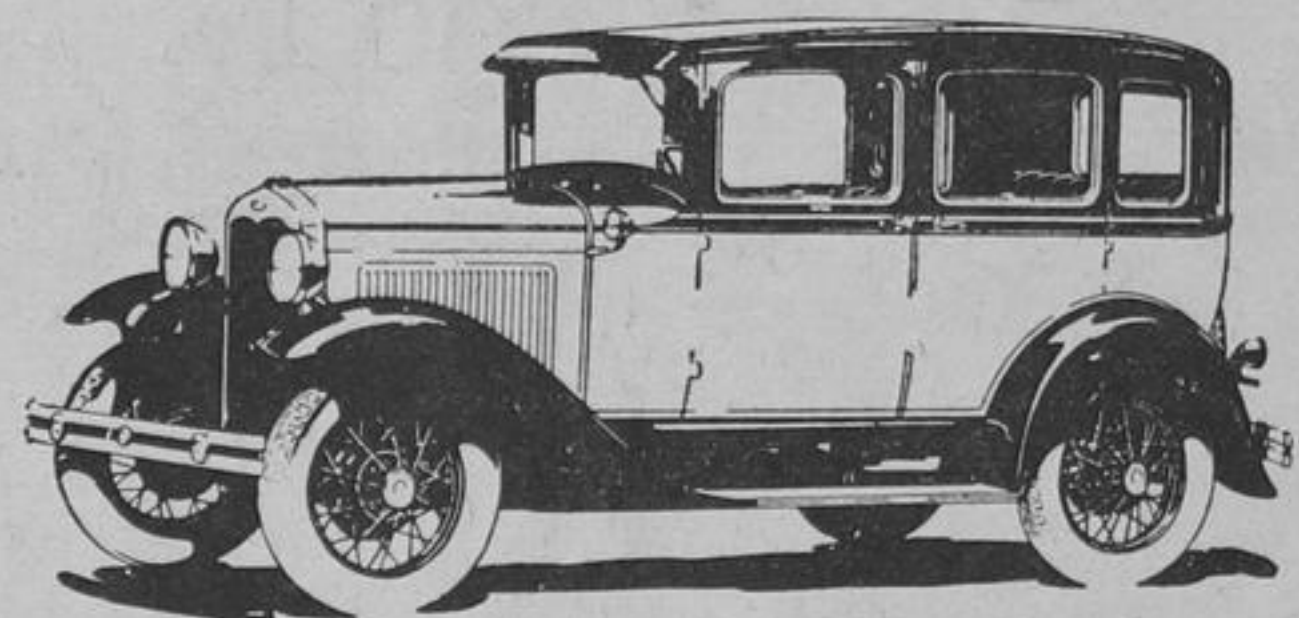
