'judicious parent' would do but one sick mind's interpretation of "corporal punishment". In any barrel of superb, deliberately destroys dedicated teachers, there will always be a few rotten apples.

If the school is ex periencing adverse behaviour that is endangering the safety of the child or other children they should report it to the parents and allow the parents to deal with it.

To contemplate strapping a child without first informing his parents, as one Trustee suggested, is unthinkable. If the child's behaviour

has deteriorated to the point where he merits this severe a disciplinary measure, the parents should have long since been involved. Moreover, what of the

epileptic child to whom a strap induced seizure might mean irreversible brain damage.

> Surely in a civilized society, if we are going to require by law that a child sit in school from ages six to 16, we have a responsibility to ensure that this is a positive kind of intervention.

We have empty classrooms begging for small self-contained classes to meet the needs of the 20 per cent or more of our children who had the misfortune, through no fault of their own, to be born something other than our concept of 'normal'

We have money for just about anything else you'd children to act out

To protect our children from physical abuse I would urge every parent of every exceptional child to direct a letter to the Director of Education forbidding the use of any form of corporal punishment and subsequently to lay an assault charge if their wishes in this respect are ignored.


