

Election limits

The town has prepared a draft bylaw putting limitations on election expenditures and requesting disclosure of campaign contributions over \$100.

Mayor Dave Schiller said a clause in the Municipal Elections Act says council may, by bylaw, provide for limitations and disclosure.

Prior to the 1976 elections, Mayor Schiller said members of council felt it was important enough to pass a resolution asking each candidate to disclose costs in excess of \$100.

"Some did and some did not," said the mayor. The amount of limitation will be discussed at a Bylaw committee meeting tonight.

Mayor Schiller said he was in favor and had been pushing for the bylaw for many years.

"I have voluntarily disclosed amounts in the last two elections," he said.

Quiet trip over the town

Bill Cole of Aurora was up in a balloon having a look at the northern boundaries of Richmond Hill Friday night.

The hot air balloon, 63 feet high and 53 feet wide is owned by Canadian Motor Industries, Toyota Limited and the Aurora resident is its "pilot".

Mr. Cole said he can go up and down by controlling the heat, but has very little right and left movement.

"So, we must go with the wind," he said.

Once it started to get dark, Mr. Cole and his passengers settled on a field just north of Richmond Hill on the Third Concession, where he was joined by his "chase vehicle" — a Toyota, of course.

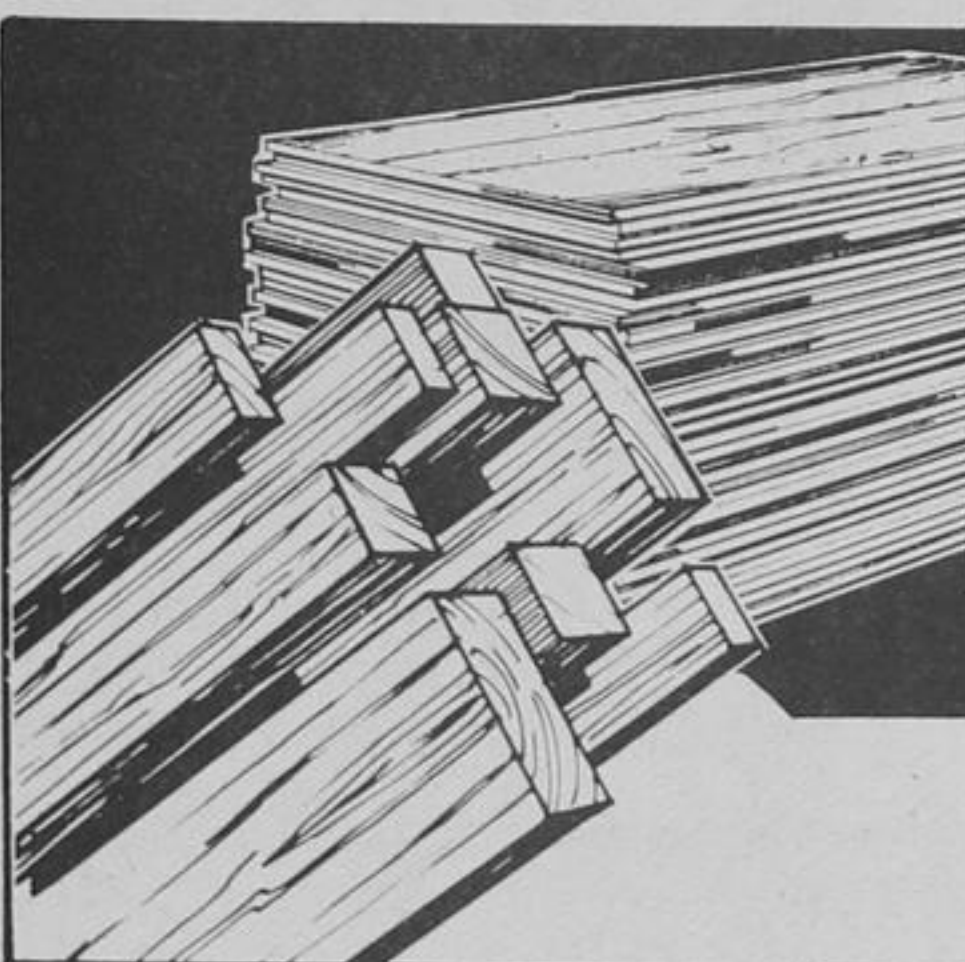

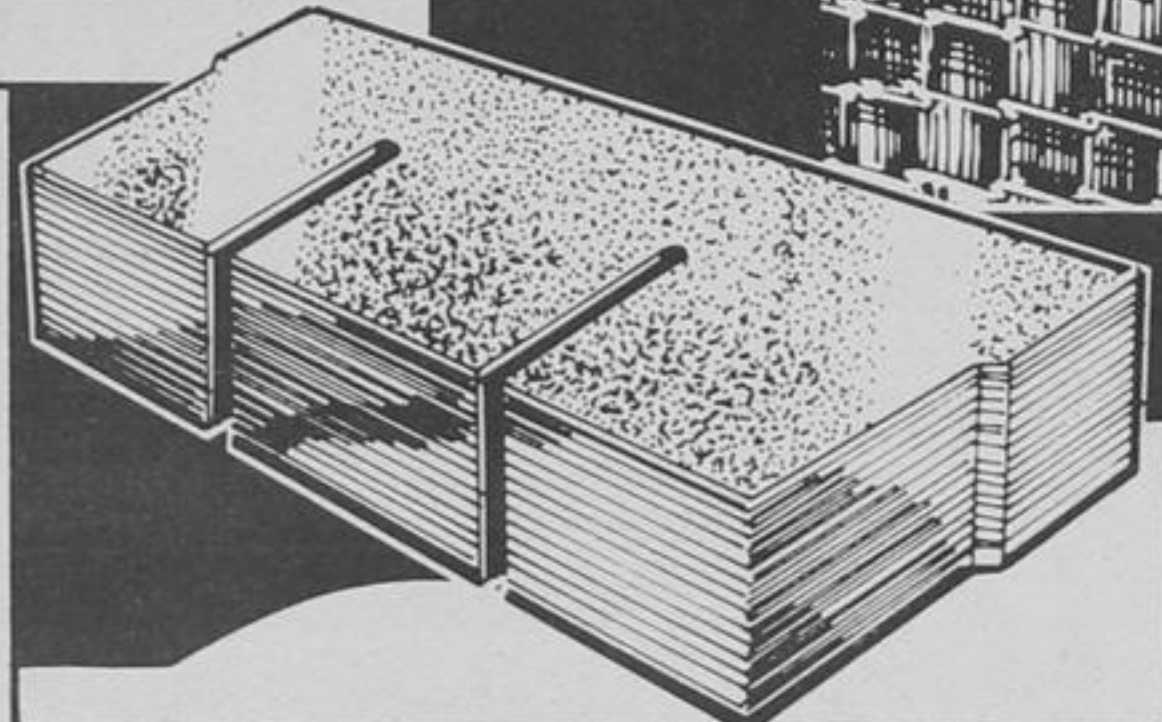
