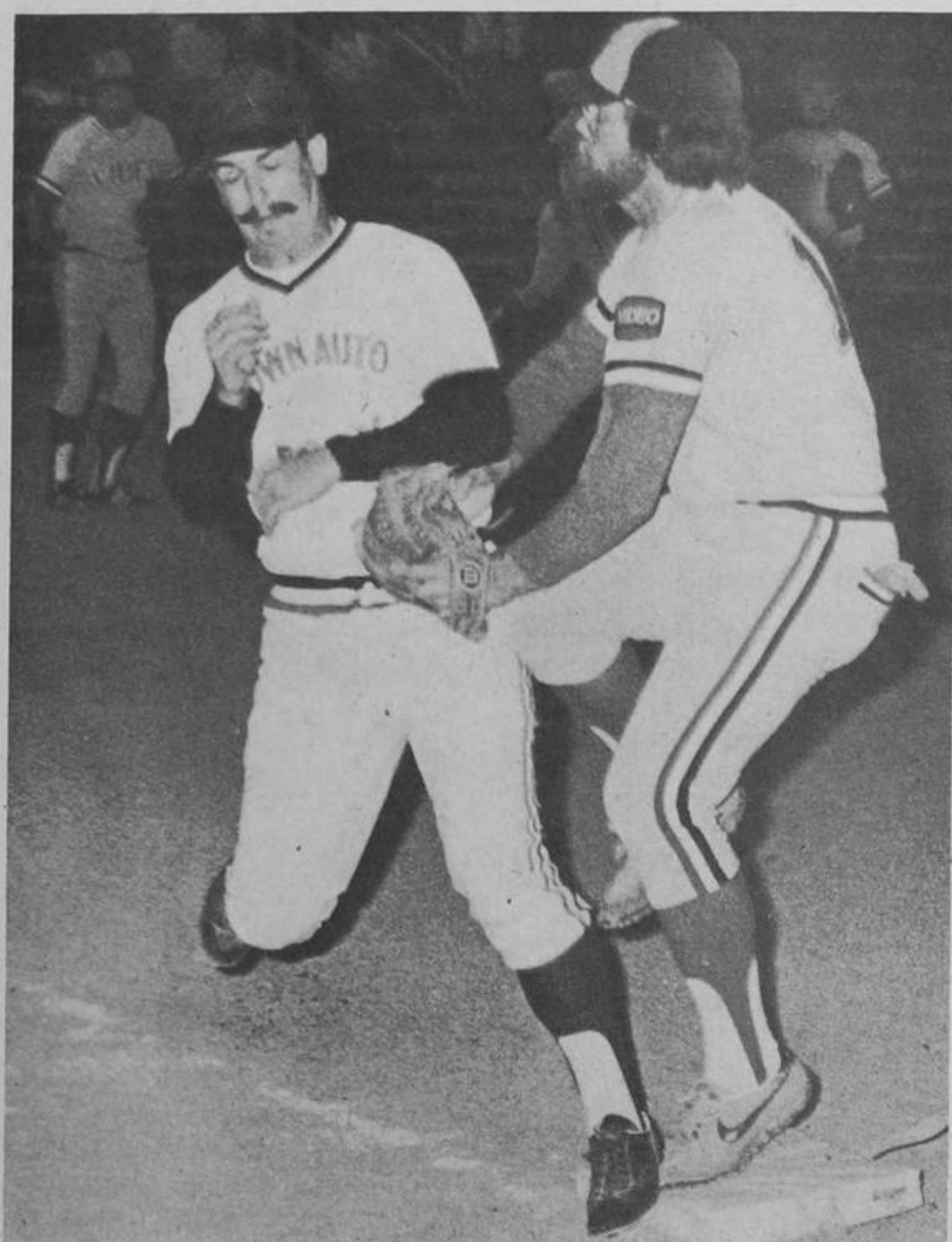


Town Auto lead final by 1-game
